Mr. Jackson Taylor left Saturday for Winchester, Wis., where he will be the guest of Mr. and Mrs. Carl Keith.

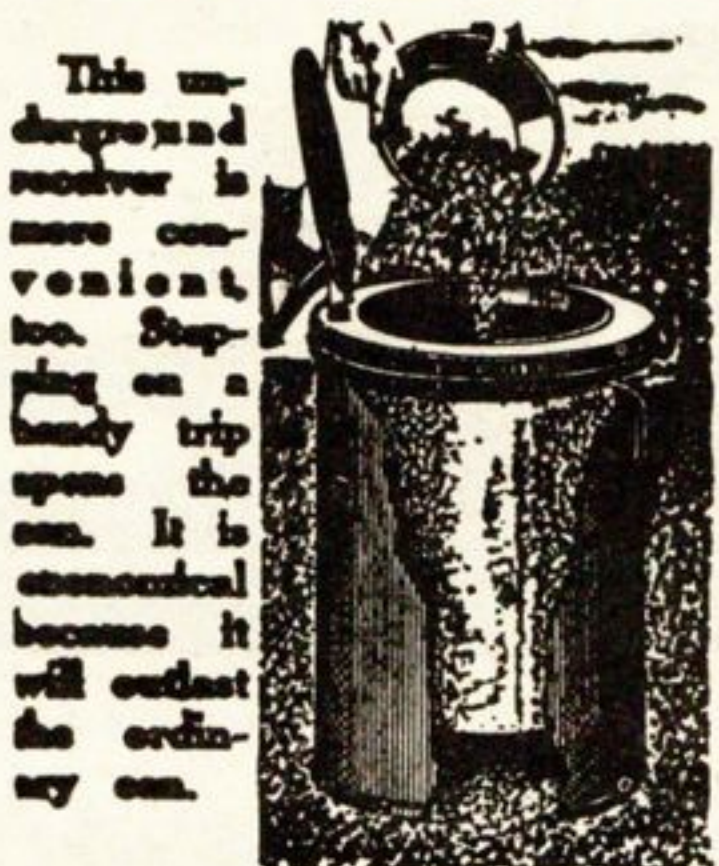

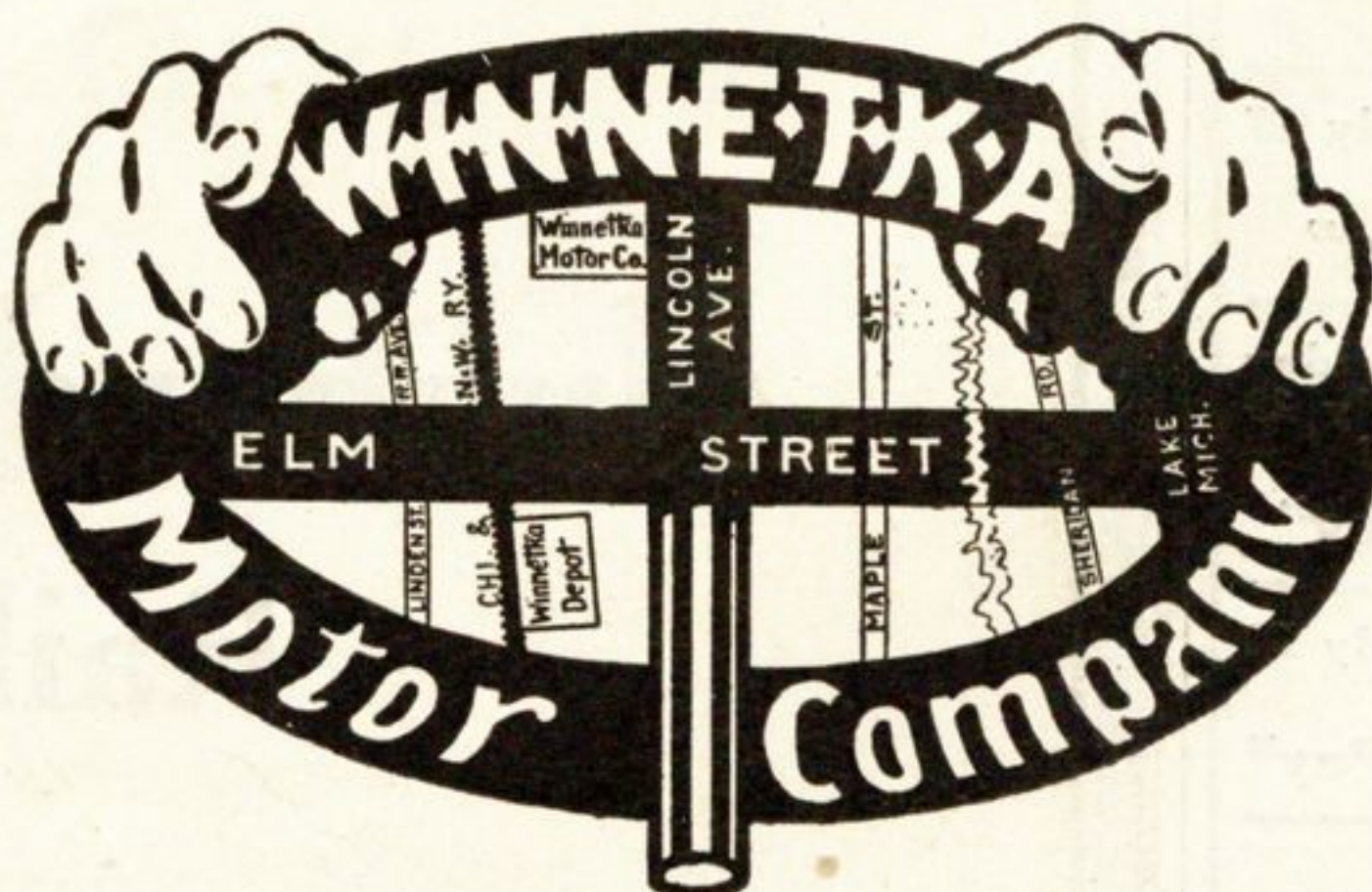
