

## News of the North Shore Golf Clubs by Everett Wilson

**S**KOKIE COUNTRY CLUB announces an exhibition golf match for Sunday with Mitchell and Duncan versus Evans and Gaudin. These four men are among the best known golfers in the country. Mitchell was runner-up in the British Championships in 1920, which event was won by his partner, Duncan. Gaudin is the professional at Skokie, while Evans is prominent for his long line of amateur winnings. The match will be over 36 holes with morning and afternoon rounds. Members may bring guests, upon the payment of a guest fee, to witness the exhibition which promises to be of the highest caliber.

The Old Boys Tournament will be held on Thursday, the details of which have not been announced. The semi-finals of the Six Towns tournament will be held on Saturday. In the preceding round brilliant playing reduced the ranks of survivors from the qualifying round by half. Four entrants are left to fight for their town cup in each division.
