During the holiday season large quantities of very small envelopes and cards are put in the mails with the result that all postal work is very much retarded and mail disfigured and mutilated. This is not generally known to the public and we want you to help us to do a little educating. Please urge the public to desist from using small size cards and envelopes which are common at the Christmas period. An untold amount of time is used in cancelling such mail by hand, as it will not pass through the cancelling machines, which are built to cancel the proper sizes of envelopes at the maximum rate of 50,000 an hour. The hand stamping not only causes delays to the small size cards and envelopes, but also delays the other mail which Want to Buy a Home? follows.

The mimimum size of cards and envelopes should not be below 23/4 by 4 inches for the reasons stated above and the following.

1. Addresses will be obliterated by cancellation mark.

2. Delay in cancellation because of awkwardness in putting through cancelling machine. 3. Delayed through difficulty in


sorting. 4. Liability to loss or damage as small sizes do not fit letter packages

and cannot be tied securely. These odd and diminutive sized pieces of stationery have come into use in the past few years and only appear now in any quantities at Christmas time when the whole postal institution is keyed up to top speed and trying to keep on top of


