WEEK OF NOVEMBER 28, 1921.

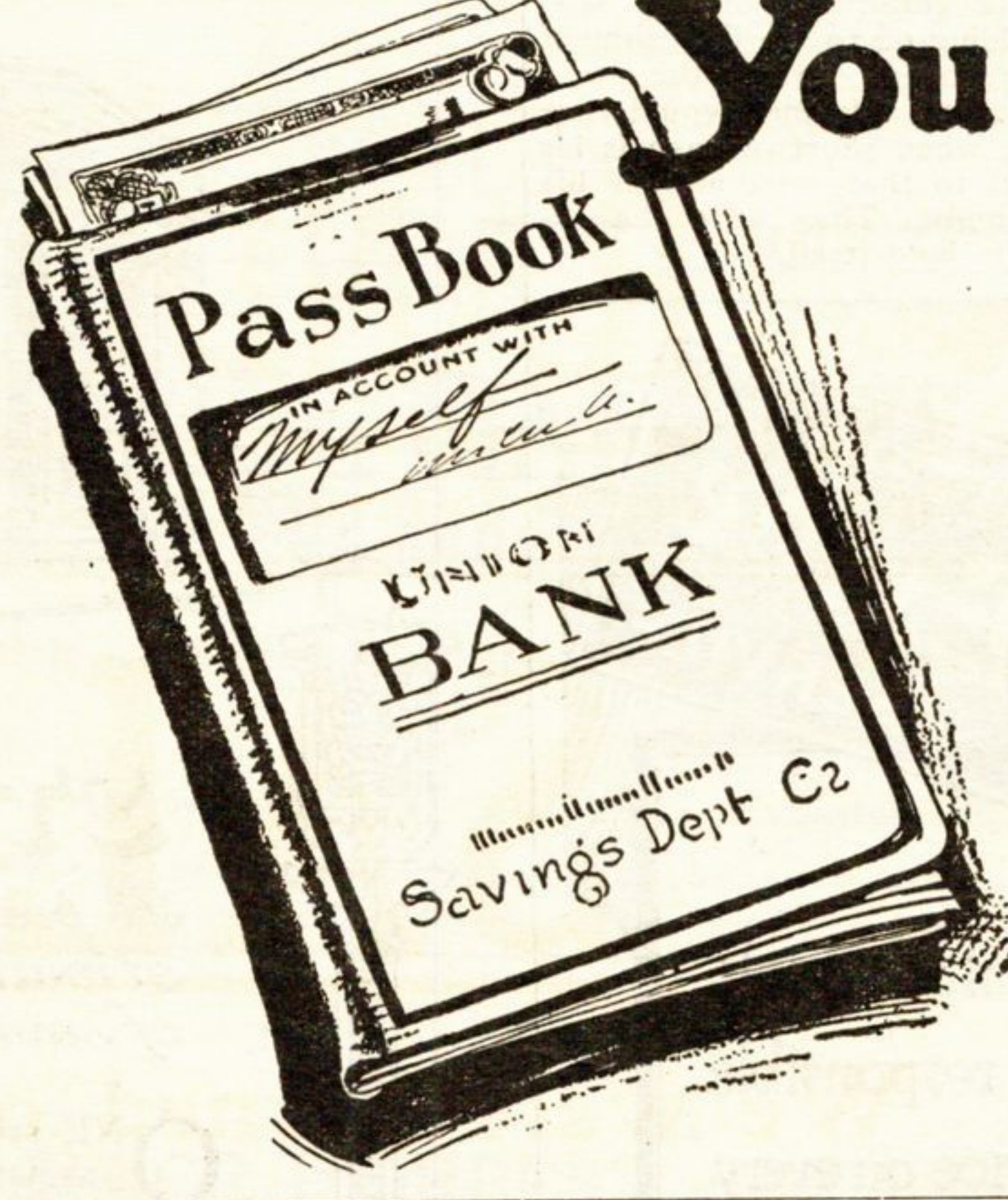
