One model is made of heavy flesh colored crepe de chine—pin tucks alternate with lace to make the top—in front there is a dainty embroidered motif—the straps are lace edged.

Another at the same price is made of flesh colored washable satin.—The bodice top is made of val and Venetian insertion combined with shirring of the satin—tiny rosettes lend it a dainty touch—the straps are satin ribbon.

A tailored model is also priced at 5.00—a deep band at the top is hemstitched and below that tiny tucks, hemstitching and a bit of embroidery trim it—the straps are satin ribbon.

AT 6.25

A superbly tailored garment made of a very heavy flesh colored crepe de chine has three clusters of tucks in front topped by two rows of hemstitching and a filet edge—the hem is edged with filet and the straps are of the material.

At the same price another tailored model is made of blue or flesh colored crepe de chine which is a very fine quality—a wide band tops it and an insert of real filet down the front is flanked by three pink and blue rosettes which hold captive two pink and blue ribbons—the straps are of self material and the hem is edged with filet.

AT 6.50

There is an elaborate model—made of flesh colored crepe de chine. To the left and right are inserts of tucked fabric, and in the front an organdy embroidered motif; all three are bound by val insertion and two rows of it edge the top band which is made of flesh georgette—the straps are of satin ribbon.

we have a tailored model made of crepe de chine. It has a square neck, hemstitched short sleeves and is tucked and hemstitched in front.

One model at 8.50 has a val lace top and sleevelet which is joined to the trousseau silk skirt by a narrow insertion—a strip of tucked georgette trims it in front.

Very lovely is this one priced at 10.50, made in a tailored style of flesh colored crepe de chine. Five half inch tucks trim the top band of georgette. The shoulder straps of real filet are edged with a narrow band of georgette. Real filet and embroidered organdy inserts joined to the yoke neck by val insertion help to make this gown one which will intrigue your fancy. The neck is square and the sleeves are short and lace edged. It is made of the finest quality of flesh colored de chine.

and one model in it is made of orchid crepe de chine. The neck is round and has a deep tailored yoke. The sleeves are short and hemstitched. A whimsical touch is added by three gold satin bows down the front. The trousers have an elastic gathered top and the ankle frills are headed by two rows of hemstitching.

Visualize this one! The coat slips over the head and the sleeves are effected by tacking the sides together in several places for it is nothing so much as an Egyptian affair made of two squares of cloth. Around the neck edging the sides and hem frilling of picoted georgette is used. Down the front and back four very prim box plaits lend a dignified air to the garment. Through them a two toned ribbon tie winds its way. The trousers have frills of georgette at the ankle.

Shadow lace and messaline either pink, orchid or blue combine to make a winning little cap which is modestly priced at 75c. Another one which is only 1.00 is made of shadow lace and pink satin ribbon.

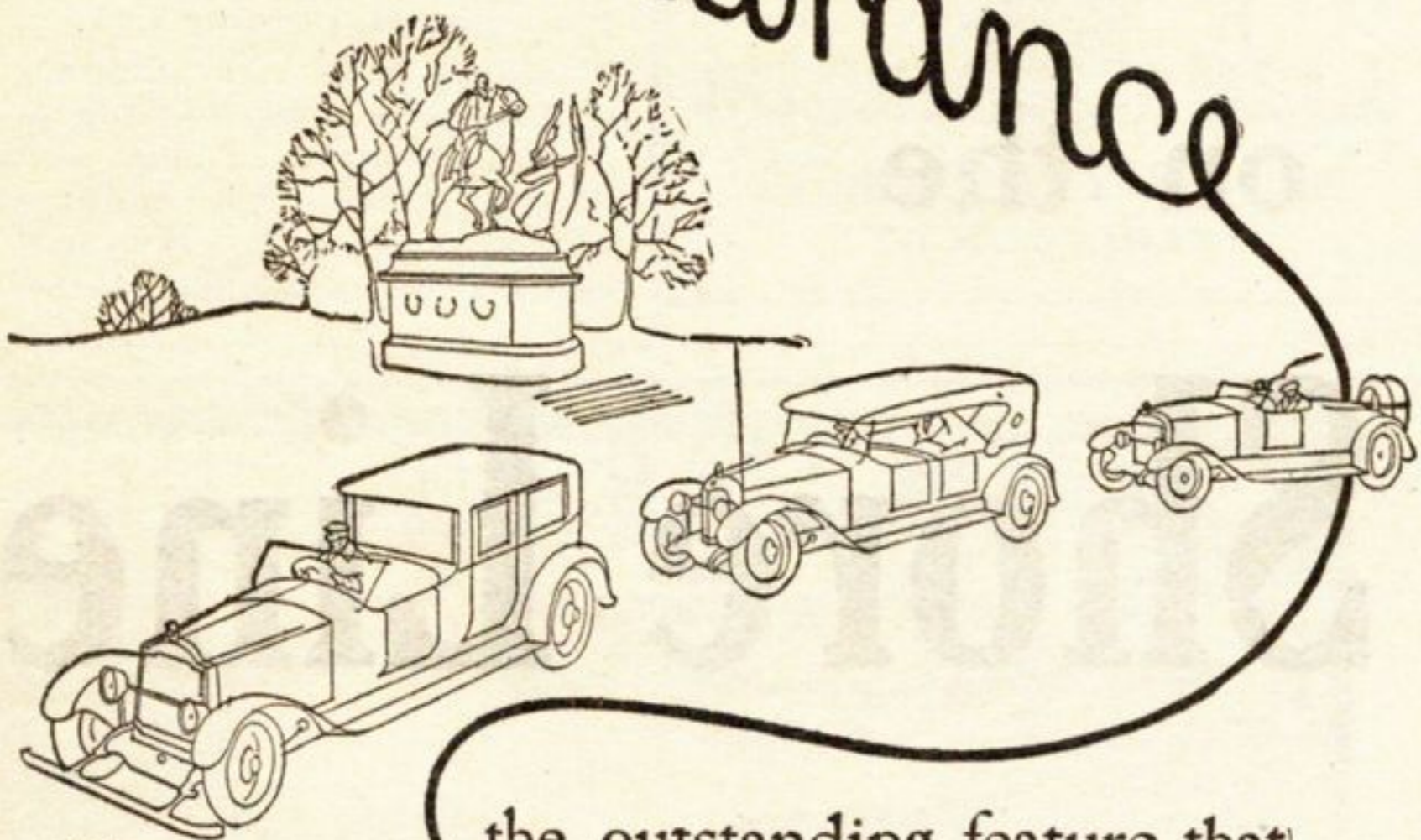
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
