

### OPEN FINE RESORT AT TOMBEAU FARMS

Wilmette Man Interested in Project Which Will Provide Excellent Summer Resort in Wisconsin

Of interest to the people of the north shore will be the development of a high class restricted summer resort near Lake Geneva.

This is being built by the Nippersink Lodge association on the famous Tombeau Farms belonging to E. G. Shinner and aggregating over 700 acres. The development is in the hands of the American Park Builders, well-known landscape architects, headed by Myron H. West, 1240 Gregory avenue, Wilmette, who is also secretary of the association, which has offices at 201 E. Ontario street, Chicago.

An eighteen hole golf course has already been constructed, which is considered one of the finest in the middle west. This has a play course of sixty-four hundred yards and possesses some unusually sporty holes.

Work has been begun on a dining hall, lodge buildings and one hundred cottages, which are being designed in English style. These buildings in reality constitute a magnificent summer hotel, the cottages taking the place of rooms and a separate dining hall serving the guests.

In conjunction there will be operated a 350 acre farm to furnish Jersey milk, chickens, eggs, berries, fruits and vegetables.

Besides golf there will be provided facilities for boating, canoeing, tennis, baseball and other games and community stables will be provided with a number of fine saddle horses. Tombeau and Benedict Lakes con-

tained within the property give frontage to approximately 200 fine cottage lots, averaging 100 feet in frontage on the water and many of them as large as 350 feet in depth. A series of lagoons aggregating a mile and one half in length will be built, giving additional frontage to lots.

Tombeau Farms have long been famous for their beauty and have for many years been the mecca of tourists and artists.

The colony, which is to be operated on a purely invitation basis, will be opened June 1922 and will represent an expenditure of over \$200,000, it is said.
