#### Much Delinquent Property

Relative to tax reduction he declared that on more than 1,000 pieces of property in New Trier township no taxes and no special assessments were being paid, these being permitted to go as delinquent. Accordingly, he pointed out, other properties in the township are taxed correspondingly higher in order to raise the required sums.


The board appointed a committee to investigate the tax situation and report on the feasbility of clearing up the titles on delinquent properties so that they might be purchased by responsible persons who would keep up the taxes and special assessments.

On Mr. Butler's suggestion that the township build a highway through the Skokie valley the board named another committee to "work towards the securing of a boulevard through the Skokie valley and thus alleviate some of the congestion along the lake shore."
