**Prof. Louis E. Hildebrandt Named
Chairman of Biology Section
of Science and Mathematics
Association**

At the annual meeting of the Central Association of Science and Mathematics Teachers, in St. Louis, during the Thanksgiving holidays, Louis E. Hildebrandt, head of the Biology department at New Trier, was chosen chairman of the Biology section. Mr. Hildebrandt has an A. M. from Northwestern, where he taught one year before coming to New Trier twelve years ago. He is a member of the Sigma Xi Honor society. He has had a wide experience as a teacher and principal in high schools, and for two summers traveled through Europe gathering specimens for his museum and also lantern slides for his lectures in Biology. He spent two summers in the west and one in the east and the south obtaining material for his work.

At present his collection consists of

of 150 mounted birds and thousands of insects, shells, rock and mineral specimens, besides a very complete herbarium. He plans to make his school museum one of the best in the state.
