Mr. Hinsdell has just finished producing the second play of the season. The people with whom he works, though not professionals, are all interested in the better theatre movement and eager to produce plays of the highest type.

Their last play, Eugene O'Neill's "Beyond the Horizon," received much favorable comment from the New Orleans newspapers. This was the most ambitious piece the company has attempted and the director was much gratified at its enthusiastic reception. Heretofore, the performances of the little company were treated as social affairs, but under Mr. Hinsdell's direction it is beginning to take up things more serious which are worthy of the most thorough dramatic criticism.

Mr. Hinsdell and his family expect to remain in New Orleans until spring when he will perhaps return to Evanston to resume his work here.
