NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN that the Winnetka Park District heretofore filed its petition in the Superior Court of Cook County, Illinois, praying for the ascertainment of the just compensation to be made for private property to be taken or damaged for use as a public park by condemning therefor the following described land, to wit:

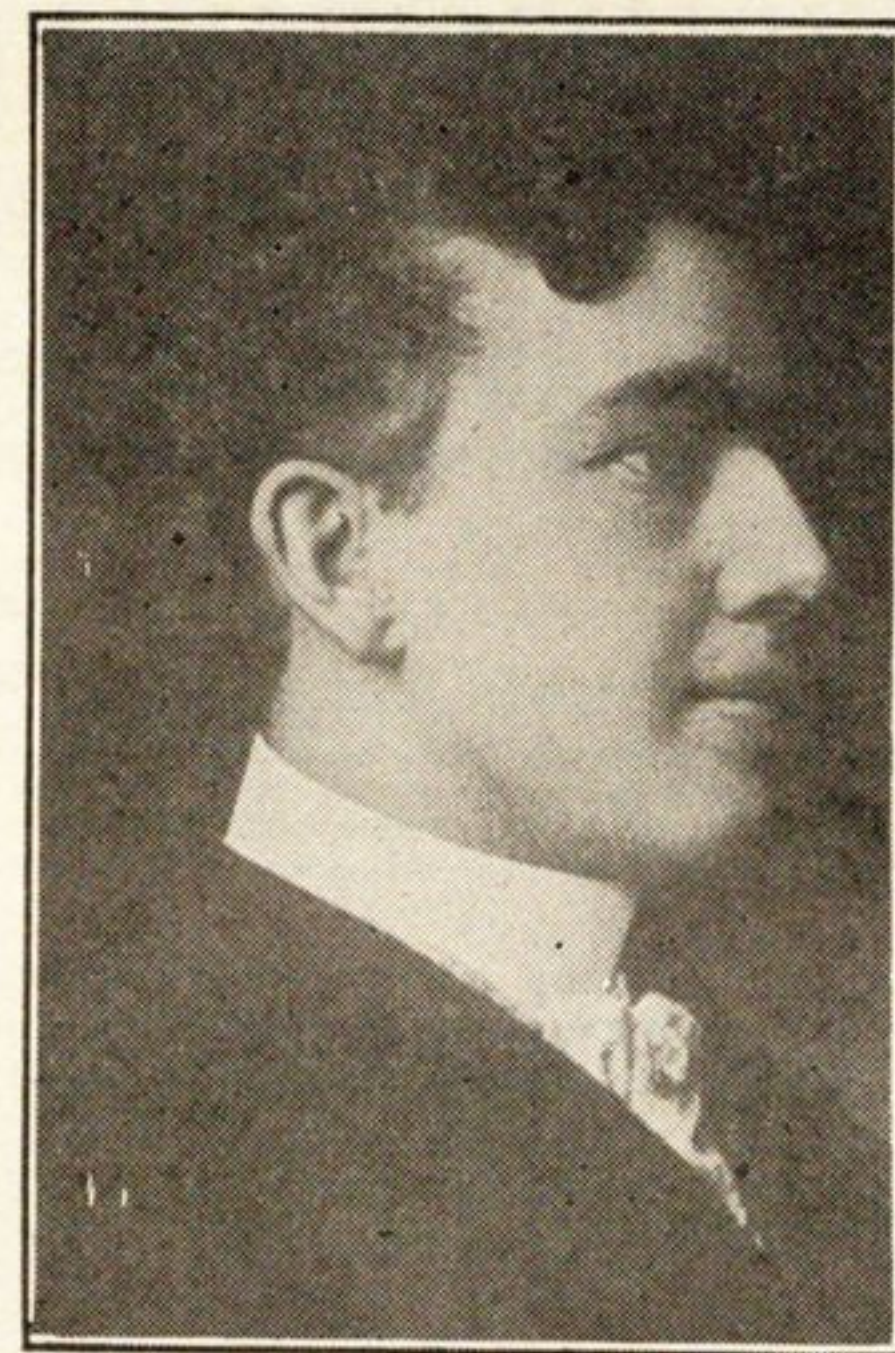
