## Winnetka Woman's Club Enjoys Two Delightful Programs

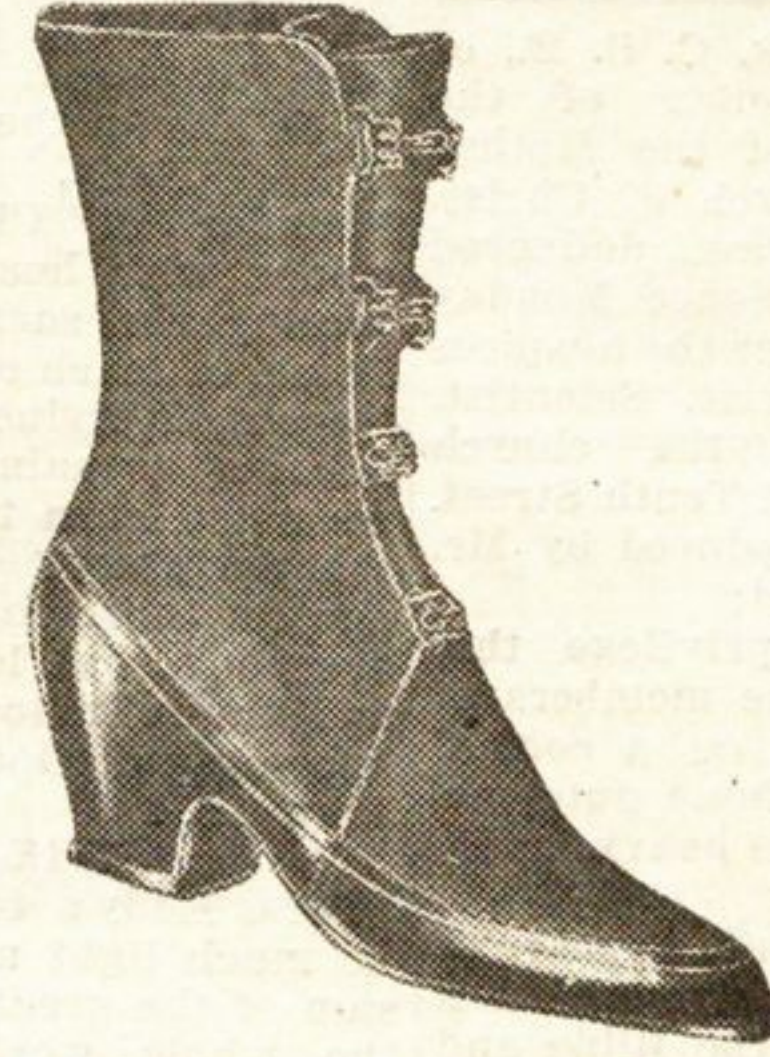

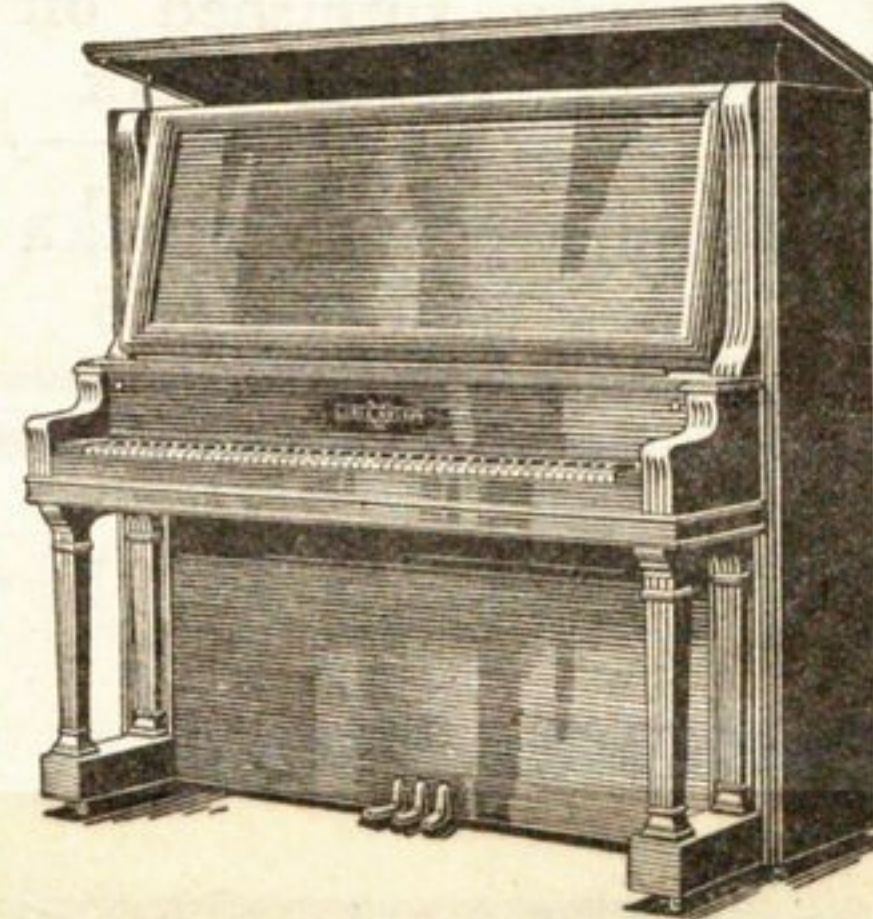
