"Wanted: Winnetka Men," is the campaign adopted by the Men's Sunday Morning Class of the Congregational church in its drive to increase its membership to the 300 mark.

The class, organized a few weeks ago, and already one of the flourishing religious-civic-social institutions in the village, meets every Sunday morning in the gymnasium of Community House under the leadership of William Ayer McKinney. The class convenes for one hour beginning at 9:45 o'clock. The express purpose of the Sunday Morning class is to effectively match up Christianity with the present day in business, home and community life. The weekly meetings have been termed "Character building programs."

The class regrets that Prof. J. M. P. Smith, who was announced last week, is prevented from attendance by illness in his family. Dr. Luckenbill is an associate of his and recommended by him. Professor Smith has

promised to be present at a later date.

The class offers a fine opportunity for the men of Winnetka to get acquainted.

There were 52 men out last Sunday. The leaders expect double that number tomorrow.

It is the endeavor of the members to make this the largest Bible class on the north shore, the wholesome influence of which will be felt throughout this vicinity.

The class is open to every man in Winnetka who can spare an hour on Sunday morning for an inspirational and instructive discussion of modern day problems as relating to Christianity, and hour of genuine fellowship.

The class is planning social programs for the near future.

ALLEGED HOLD-UP TRIO HELD FOR OTHER JOBS
