Mrs. Frank Kubicek, 964 Spruce street, will sail on February 19, for Germany.

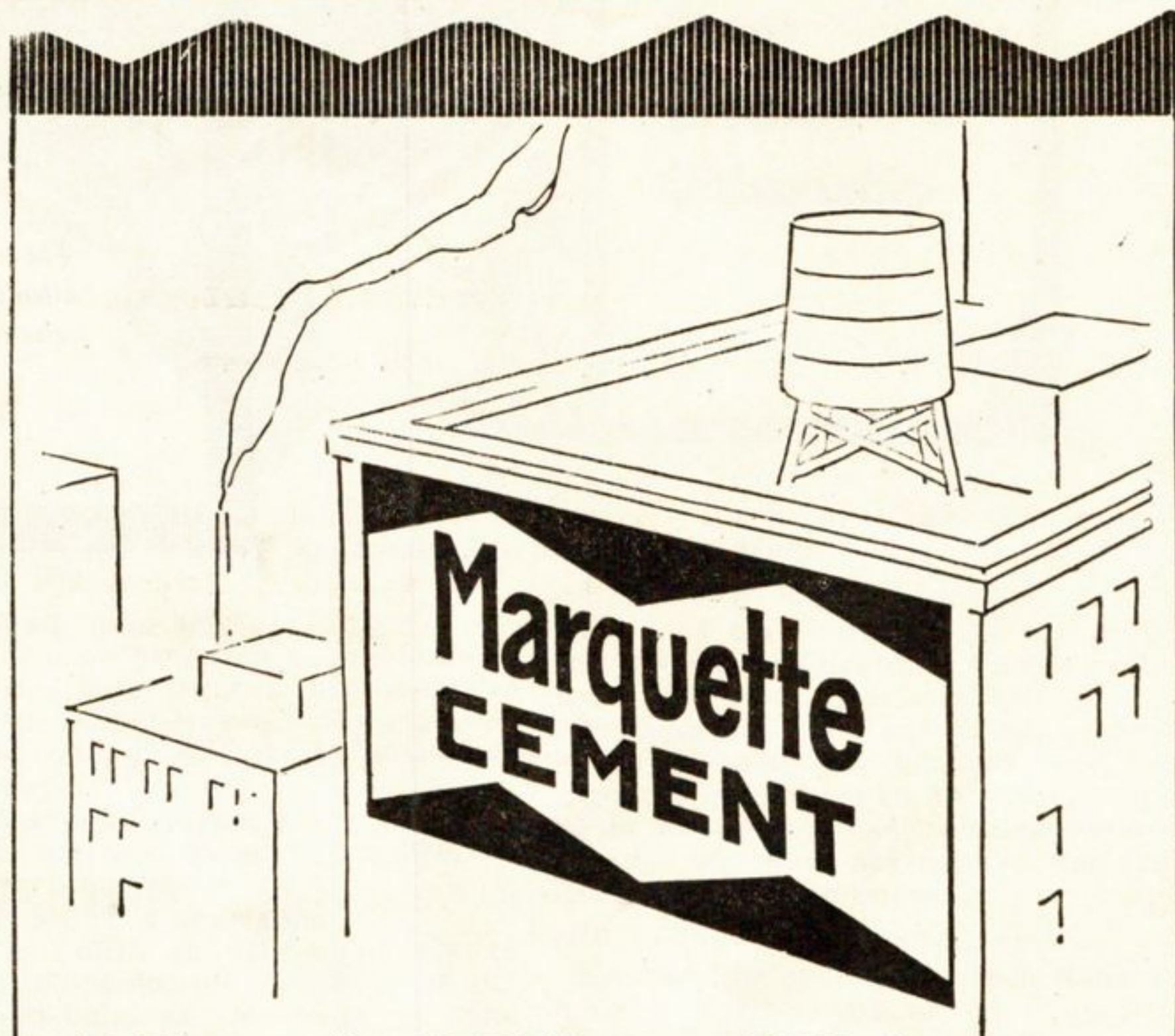
