A group of men who left Winnetka five years ago to do their part in the World War came back after three years of fighting and formed the Win- lative work. F. O. Mason, as Adjutant, the post grew from a group of fifty men to one hundred within a year's time. It was during Commander Dickinson's time that the first Cabaret Ball was given and proved to be an unusual success. Memorial trees to the men who lost their lives in the service were planted on the Winnetka Common and dedicated on July 4th of that year.

The post at the present time has two hundred members in the village. Men from all walks of life make up the list of the post and among the more active members are some of the leading business men of Chicago. Women who acted as nurses, telephone operators and in the many other branches of the service are members of the local post and have within the past year been regular atendants at

Legion meetings.
