The wood-working shop, for example, is a large, well-lighted, bricklined room equipped with benches, wood-working machinery and a machine lathe. Separated from the woodworking shop on the east by a glass partition is a small forge room with one or two forges to be used in connection with the shop work. On the west is the print shop, to which the printing presses, type cases, etc., will be moved from the Horace Mann School.

Science, Cooking Rooms

On the opposite side of the north corridor are the general science laboratory, cooking room, and sewing room. The sewing room is provided with fitting rooms in which the girls may try on the dresses they make for themselves. The sewing room opens into the cooking room by two doors, so that it may be used also as a lunch room. The partition between the two rooms has a sliding panel, through which food can be passed to the counter in the sewing room, the sewing tables being used as lunch tables at noon.

The cooking room has a kitchen unit in the corner nearest the sewing room where school lunches will be prepared, the rest of the room being occupied by standard domestic science

desks and equipment.

Beyond the cooking room is a general science laboratory which will also be used as a session rem for the children. Class room No. 15. disafirst rom north of the assembly hall, is finished as an art room. It contains a large open fire place. There are casement windows with window seats and the whole room is made to simulate a living room. Here the girls will learn the principles of interior decoration as well as receive their regular instruction in art work. Farther down the corridor comes the finishing room, which is for the joint use of the art department and the shops. Children from the art room take their rougher work into the finishing room and boys from the woodworking shop do their painting and varnishing here, away from the sawdust of the manual traing room.




