During the present year fifty students of the high school, accompanied by Mrs. Cotton, have attended the monthly children's concerts at Orchestra hall given by the complete Symphony orchestra conducted by Frederick Stock.

Concerts Nearer Home

These concerts were so popular with the students that it was decided to make an effort to bring at least a part of the orchestra to New Trier so that more students and the residents of the north shore might enjoy the concerts nearer home.

Mrs. Cotton set about without delay to secure the services of the "Little Symphony," directed by George Dasch.

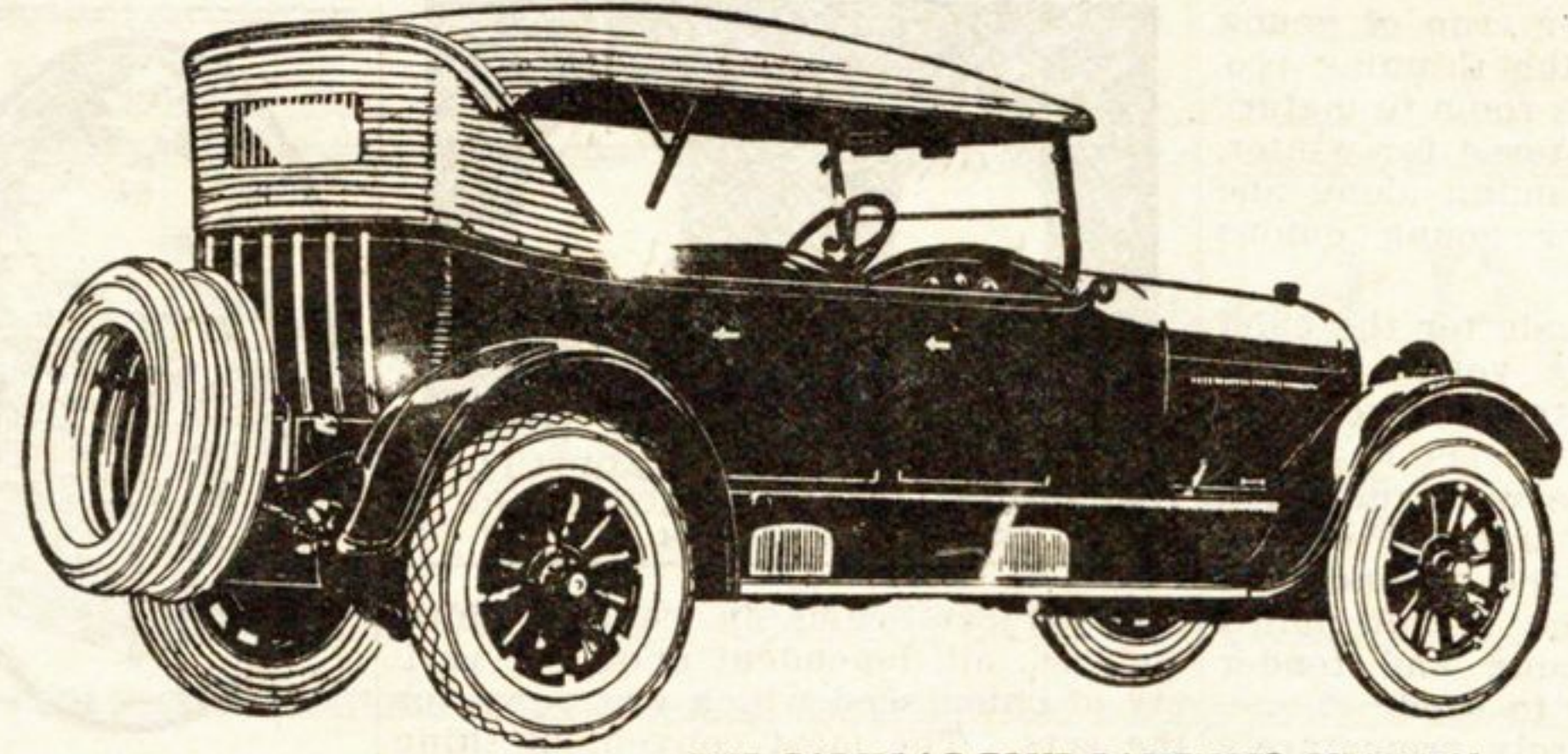
Both High school and grammar school pupils of the township are to be invited to the concerts, together with their parents and friends.

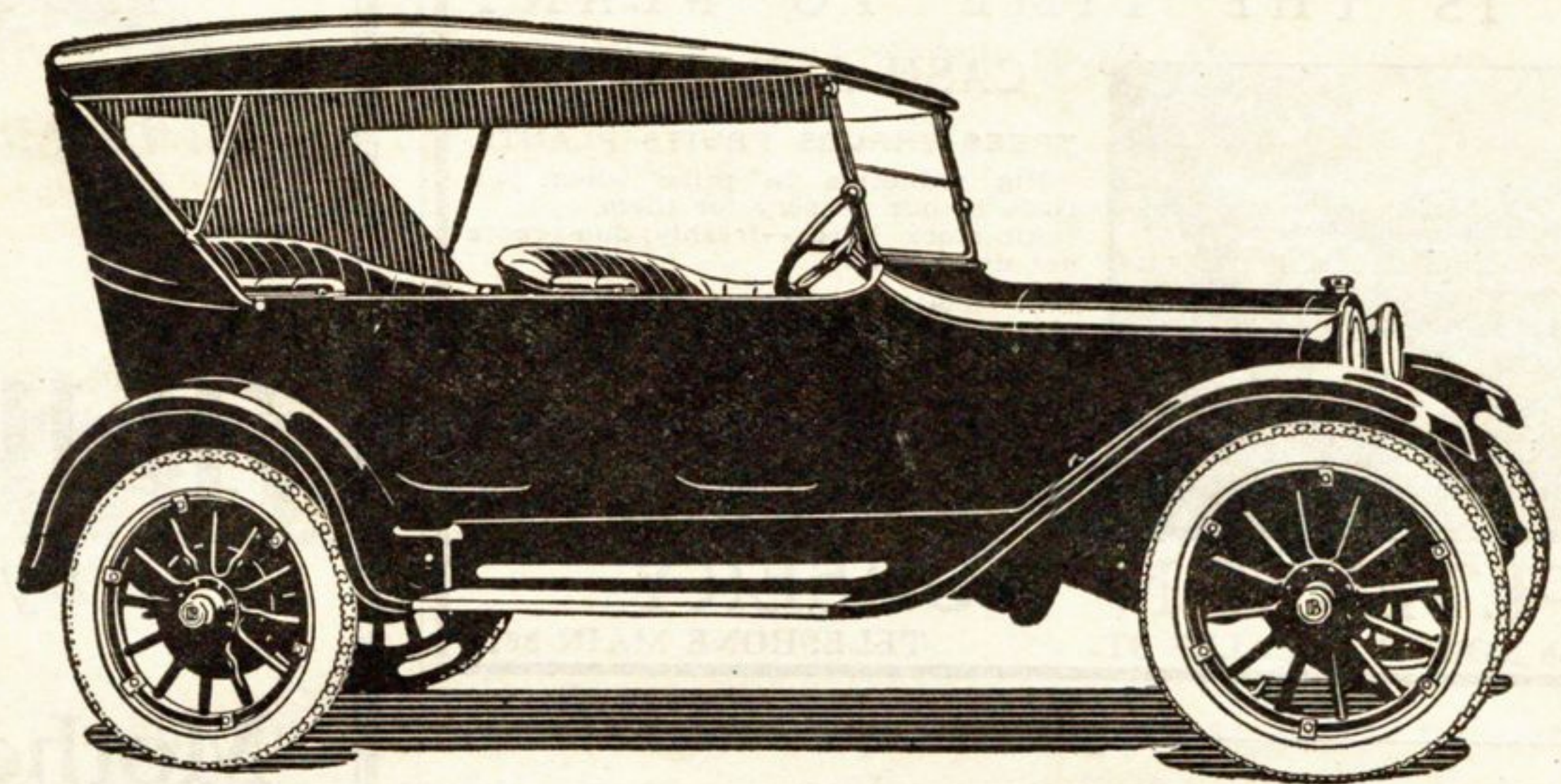
