RED CROSS REPORTS ON 14 MONTHS' WORK

What is being done for the disabled ex-service man by the Chicago Chapter American Red Cross, is told in their annual report. Trained counsel and relief were given to 66,882 disabled men in fourteen months. For the men who have no homes arrangements were made to provide lodging and food; necessary clothing was provided and carfare.

Ninety-five per cent of the active cases are those of very ill men; men who are in hospitals or receiving outpatient treatment. 
