Ridge and Lake Avenues, Willow Road Included in Commissioner's List

SHERER URGES WORK

Willow Road to Be Paved With Funds Saved

Herbert H. Sherer, New Trier Township Highway Commissioner, is making excellent progress with the township road paving program for this season, according to a report from his offices in Glencoe this week.

Preliminary legal matters have been concluded, according to Commissioner Sherer, and work is soon to be started on several important paving projects in the district west of the north shore villages.

Among these improvements is the paving with concrete of Ridge avenue from Lake avenue, Wilmette, to Central street, Evanston, a State Aid project, on which work will begin later in the summer.

Another project of interest to all north shore motorists is the prospective paving with concrete of Lake avenue, from the end of the concrete pavement laid by the township two years ago, and extending west to Waukegan road.

Plans are also completed for the paving of Winslow road, from the Winnetka village limits west to the west line of the Chicago and Northwestern railroad right-of-way in the Skokie. Commissioner Sherer proposes to complete this improvement with the approximately \$30,000 which he has saved for the township from the general taxes in the last two years, a saving effected by Mr. Sherer through commendable efficiency and economy in the highway division of the township government.
