ONE OF NOAH'S PETS

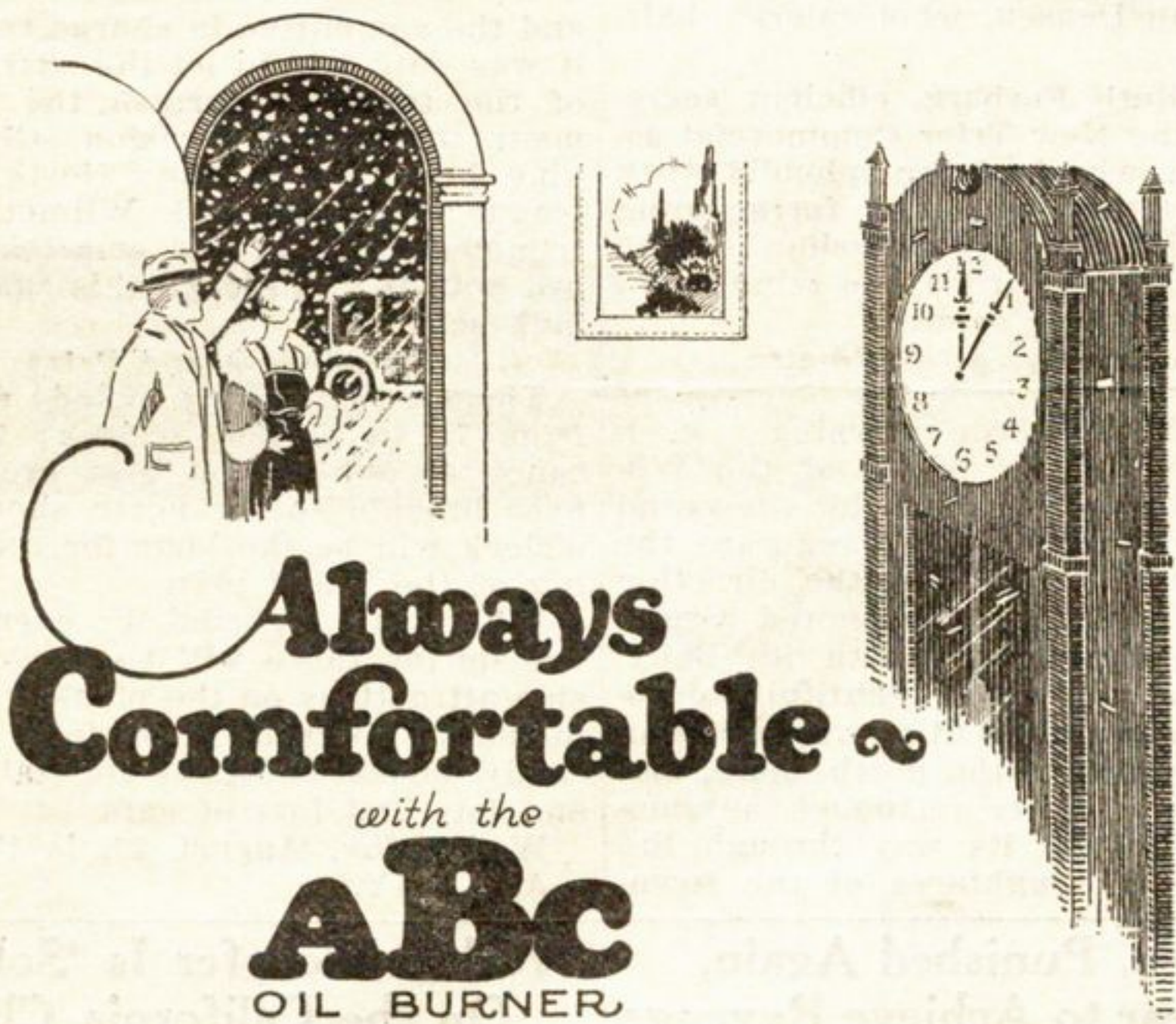


