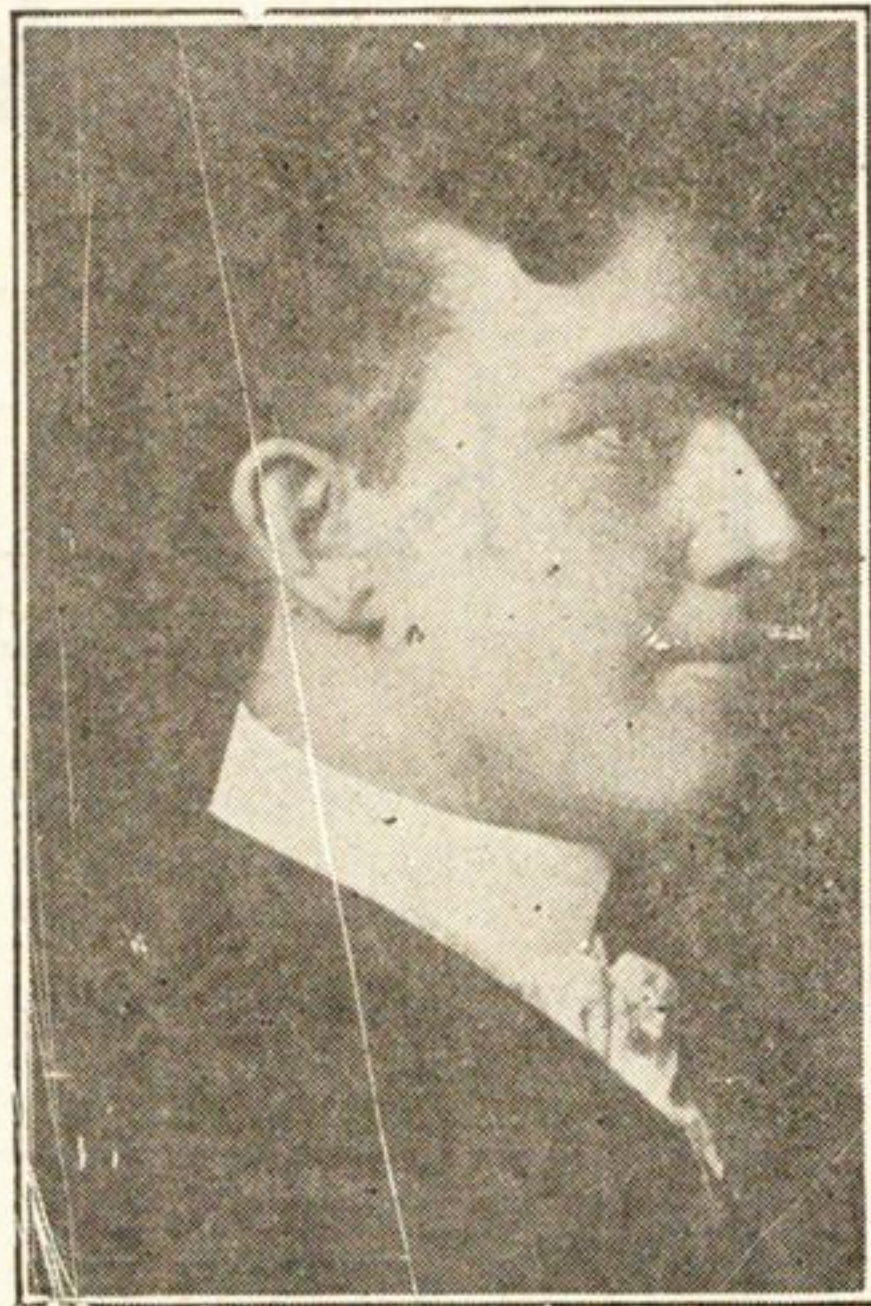
FIREARMS TRAFFIC

The fact that the selling of firearms without license and the carrying of concealed weapons by individuals are both offenses against the federal government seems in no way to deter dealers in guns from advertising their wares to the public. On the contrary, they grow more assiduous in their efforts to attract buyers. Alluring advertisements sent to newspapers with authorization to run them frequently and with no stipulation regarding space rates indicate a determination to get their goods across to the buying public regardless of expense or danger of indictment.

This paper has received an advertisement from an Indiana firm whose letterhead announces in bold type that they are distributors of Imported and Domestic Arms and Ammunition, asking that we run their display advertisement for "Military Automatics". The advertisement gives full directions for ordering guns of every description by mail and careful instructions to **SEND NO MONEY** with the order, but to

pay the postman who delivers the parcel. No license is required for this mail order traffic outside of the home state and the dealer who is willing to spend money for ad-

vertising space in papers not too scrupulous to sell it can dispose of his stock without fear of being overtaken by the long arm of the law.

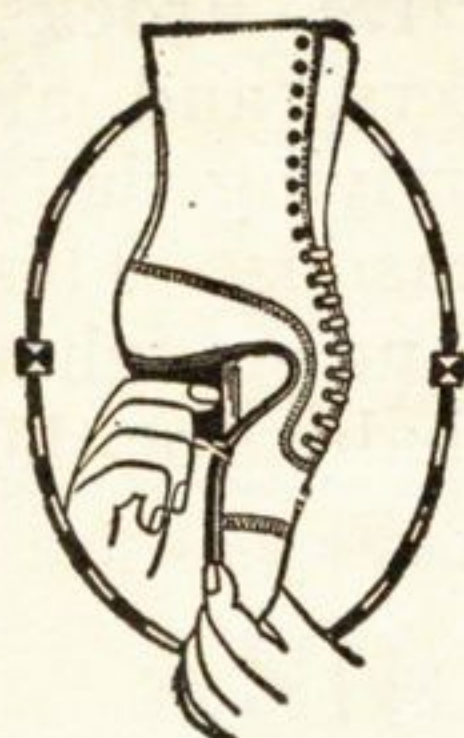

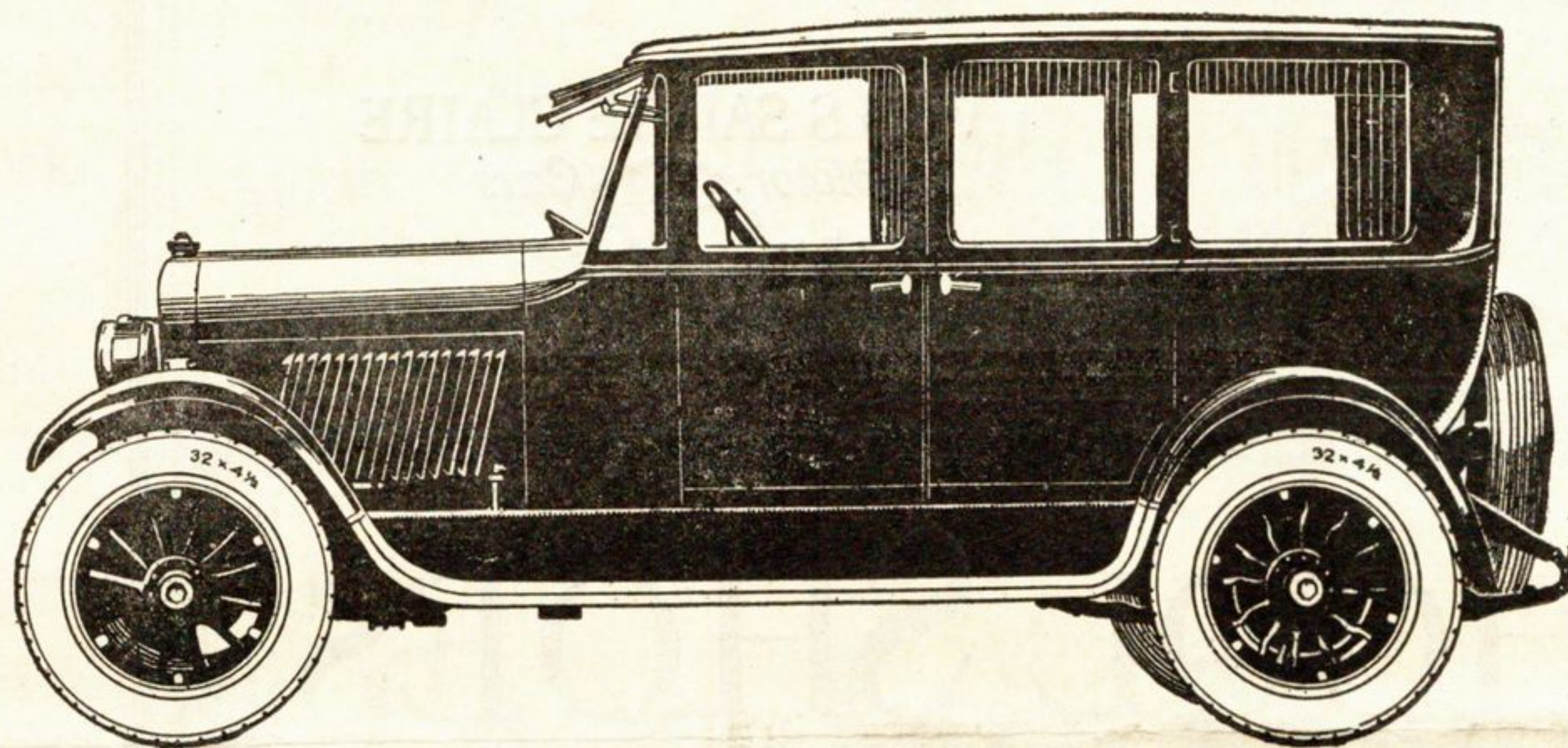
