Meet Monday to Discuss "Better Street Lights"

The meeting, arranged through the initiative of the New Trier Commercial association, is to be quite important since the expressions of the business men will, no doubt, have considerable bearing upon action that will be taken eventually in regard to securing adequate street lighting for the business district.

Prices up to September 30, 1922, \$20.00, \$80.00, \$800.00.

Prices on and after October 1, 1922, \$20.50, \$82.00, \$820.00


