Can you suggest any subject or series of subjects you will like to have treated in sermons or mid-week services?

Building Proposition Item One question has to do with the

proposition of remodeling the present church edifice or the construction of an entirely new building. The parishioners are asked to express their

views and offer suggestions relative to this proposition.

The final question takes the parishioner's thoughts far beyond the confines of the church. It reads: Have you any suggestions, big or little, for increasing and improving the service of our church to Winnetka and the world?






