

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at a regular meeting of the Council of the Village of Winnetka held on the fifth day of September, 1922, the following ordinance was passed by three-fourths of the members of the said Council:

The Council of the Village of Winnetka do ordain:

SECTION 1. That the following described real estate, to-wit:

The South Ninety-nine (99) feet of Lot Four (4) in the re-subdivision of Blocks One (1), Two (2), Three (3), and Four (4), and the vacated street known as Bellevue Place, lying between Blocks One (1) and Two (2) on the east and Blocks Three (3) and Four (4) on the west, in Lake Shore subdivision of Lot One (1) in Nicholas Simon and Others' Subdivision of part of the Southeast fractional 1/4 of Section Twenty-one (21) and of fractional Southwest quarter (SW 1/4) of Section Twenty-two (22), Township Forty-two (42) North, Range Thirteen (13) East of the Third Principal Meridian, in Cook County, Illinois, being vacant and unimproved and at no time used by the said Village for any purpose, is no longer necessary, appropriate or required for the use of the said Village or profitable to said Village, nor is its longer retention by said Village for the best interests of the said Village, and that the said real estate be sold pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided.

SECTION 2. That a copy of this ordinance, together with a proposal to sell the said real estate, shall be published in the Winnetka Weekly Talk, a newspaper published regularly in said Village on Saturday of each week, for a period of not less than sixty days after the taking effect of this ordinance, which proposal to sell shall state that all bids received for the said real estate will be considered and opened at a regular meeting of the Council of said Village on, to-wit: November 21st, 1922.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by a vote of three-fourths of the members of the Council of the Village of Winnetka, its approval and posting.

and that bids for the purchase of said property will be received by the Village Clerk, up to eight (8) o'clock P. M. November 21st, 1922, which bids will be duly opened and considered at the meeting of the said Council to be held November 21st, 1922, in the Village Hall of the Village of Winnetka, at eight (8) o'clock P. M. All bids sent to the said Village Clerk shall be marked on the outside "Bid for real estate." The said Council reserves the right, pursuant to statute, to reject by majority vote any or all bids. The said real estate will be conveyed by the Village of Winnetka by proper and sufficient deed to the bidder whose bid shall be accepted, and who shall duly pay or secure the purchase price therefor to the Village of Winnetka.

NOTICE OF ELECTION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on Saturday, the 30th day of September, 1922, an election will be held in New Trier Township High School District, in Township Forty-two (42) North, Range Thirteen (13), East of the Third Principal Meridian, in Cook County, Illinois, for the purpose of voting "for" or "against" the proposition to issue the bonds of the New Trier Township High School District, in Township Forty-two (42) North, Range Thirteen (13), East, aforesaid, in Cook County, Illinois, for building school houses, to the amount of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000), which bonds shall be issued and sold from time to time as the proceeds are needed for the purposes herein specified and authorized by law; which bonds are to be dated the 1st day of January, 1923, are to consist of five hundred (500) in number, of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) each; and are to bear interest at the rate of 4 1/2% per annum, payable semi-annually. Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) in amount of said bonds shall become due on the 1st day of July in each of the years 1924 to 1930; Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) in amount of said bonds shall become due on the 1st day of July, in each of the years 1931 to 1935, and Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000) in amount of said bonds shall become due on the 1st day of July, in each of the years 1936 to 1942.

There are four precincts in the district. Precinct No. 1 comprises the following described territory:

Commencing at the Northeast corner of the New Trier Township High School District; thence West along the North line of the said District to the Northwest corner of said District; thence South and East along the Westerly line of said District to Edson Avenue, which there is the dividing line between the Villages of Glencoe and Winnetka; thence easterly along said Edson Avenue and Edson Avenue, extended, to Lake Michigan; thence Northwesterly along the shore line of Lake Michigan to the place of beginning, and the polling place for such precinct shall be at McGuire & Orr's real estate office, situate on Park Avenue, opposite the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad Station, in the Village of Glencoe, Illinois.

Precinct No. 2 comprises the following described territory:

Commencing at the point of intersection of Edson Avenue with the West line of the New Trier Township High School District; thence South along the west line of said District to the point of intersection of Winnetka Avenue, extended, therewith; thence easterly along Winnetka Avenue, extended, Winnetka Avenue and Winnetka Avenue again extended, to Lake Michigan; thence northwesterly along the shore line of Lake Michigan to the point of intersection of Edson Avenue, extended, therewith; thence west along Edson Avenue, extended, and Edson Avenue, to the place of beginning, and the polling place for such precinct shall be at the Horace Mann School, at the corner of Elm and Chestnut Streets, in the Village of Winnetka, Illinois.

Precinct No. 3 comprises the following described territory:

Commencing at the point of intersection of Winnetka Avenue, extended, with the west line of the New Trier Township High School District; thence south along the west line of said District, one-half mile; thence East on a straight line to the shore line of Lake Michigan; thence northwesterly along the shore line of Lake Michigan to the point of intersection of Winnetka Avenue, extended, therewith; thence westerly along Winnetka Avenue, extended, Winnetka Avenue and Winnetka Avenue, again extended, to the place of beginning, and the polling place for such precinct shall be at the Railroad Station of the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad Company, opposite the public square, in the Village of Kenilworth, Illinois.

Precinct No. 4 comprises the following described territory:

Commencing at a point in the west line of the New Trier Township High School District, which is one-half mile south of the point of intersection of said west line with Winnetka Avenue, extended, as a place of beginning; thence east on a straight line to the shore line of Lake Michigan; thence south easterly along the shore line of Lake Michigan to the point of intersection of the boundary line of the New Trier Township High School District therewith; thence south and west along the southerly line of said District to the Southwest corner of said District; thence North along the west line of said District to the place of beginning, and the polling place for such precinct shall be at the Village Hall, at Central and Wilmette Avenues, in the Village of Wilmette, Illinois.

The polls will be opened at 1 o'clock P. M. and close at 6:30 o'clock P. M.
