

SURELY DOCTORS CAN BE HEALTHY PERSONS

School Moves to Guard Health of Medics

On the theory that physicians should be as hardy physically and alert mentally as any group of individuals in the world, the faculty of Northwestern University Medical School, with the co-operation of President Walter Dill Scott and the trustees, is now establishing a system of physical and mental "audits" that may eventually make the 400 young men studying medicine at Northwestern the healthiest group of their class in the world. The plan is based wholly upon the idea that tyro physicians cannot do better by themselves during the college stage of their careers than by perfecting themselves physically. It is hoped that by continually supervising their health the "medics" at Northwestern will be able to study to greater advantage, work harder and longer and enjoy life more fully than if there were no supervision at all.

Dr. William A. Evans, professor of public health at Northwestern University Medical School, is chairman of a special committee of physicians which has charge of the work, his colleagues being Dr. W. C. Gilbert, Dr. W. H. Holmes, Dr. John A. Wolfer, Dean Arthur I. Kendall, head of the medical school, and President Walter

Dill Scott. Dr. M. A. Andreean has been appointed student health advisor at the medical school, which is located at South Dearborn street, just adjacent to Wesley Hospital, near Twenty-fifth street. Chairman Evans outlined the general scheme as follows:

"Our plan is to make each year a thorough physical audit of our medical students and to keep in touch with them throughout the nine months of their work both as to physical well-being and as to progress they are making in their studies based on the results of special mental alertness analyses. A fee is charged merely to cover expenses but our purpose is to help the young men who are engaged in the serious work of studying medicine and so to maintain their morals as to permit them to

make the most of their time and opportunities. Save for the fact that Cornell started a similar activity last year and that Columbia is now taking it up, I think Northwestern is the first medical school to apply the principle to all its students.

Children to Benefit by Tag Day in Wilmette
