street lighting in this country. Following are some of the arguments printed in a New England paper, which represented the best and most serious thought of that time:

2. A medical objection. Emanations of illuminating gas are injurious. Lighted streets will incline people to remain late out of doors, thus leading to increase of ailments by colds.

3. A moral objection. The fear of

4. Police objection. Horses will be frightened and thieves emboldened. 5. Objections from the people. If streets are illuminated every night, such constant illumination will rob festive occasions of their charm.
