

CHESTNUT ST. TO GET \$35,000 STUCCO HOME

Building permits issued since October 10 by Erwin Dames, superintendent of public works, show a slight increase over the preceding week's total. The estimated cost of structures permitted this week was \$69,650 as compared to \$60,000 the week before.

The largest single item in this amount is the \$35,000 two and a half story stucco residence which C. C. Daughaday has been authorized to build at 172 Chestnut street. A permit was also issued to Lamson H. Date to build a two story brick veneer house at 677 Walden Road. The estimated cost of this residence is \$16,000.

Edwin K. Lundy received a permit to construct a two story residence at an estimated cost of \$10,000 at 1423 Prairie ave. Another permit was issued to George Bisset to erect an \$8,000 brick veneer and stucco house at 414 Linden ave.

Permits for the construction of private garages were granted to Harold Martin, 519 Fir street, and to W. F. Murphy and W. T. Wehrstedt, 906 and 912 Cherry street.

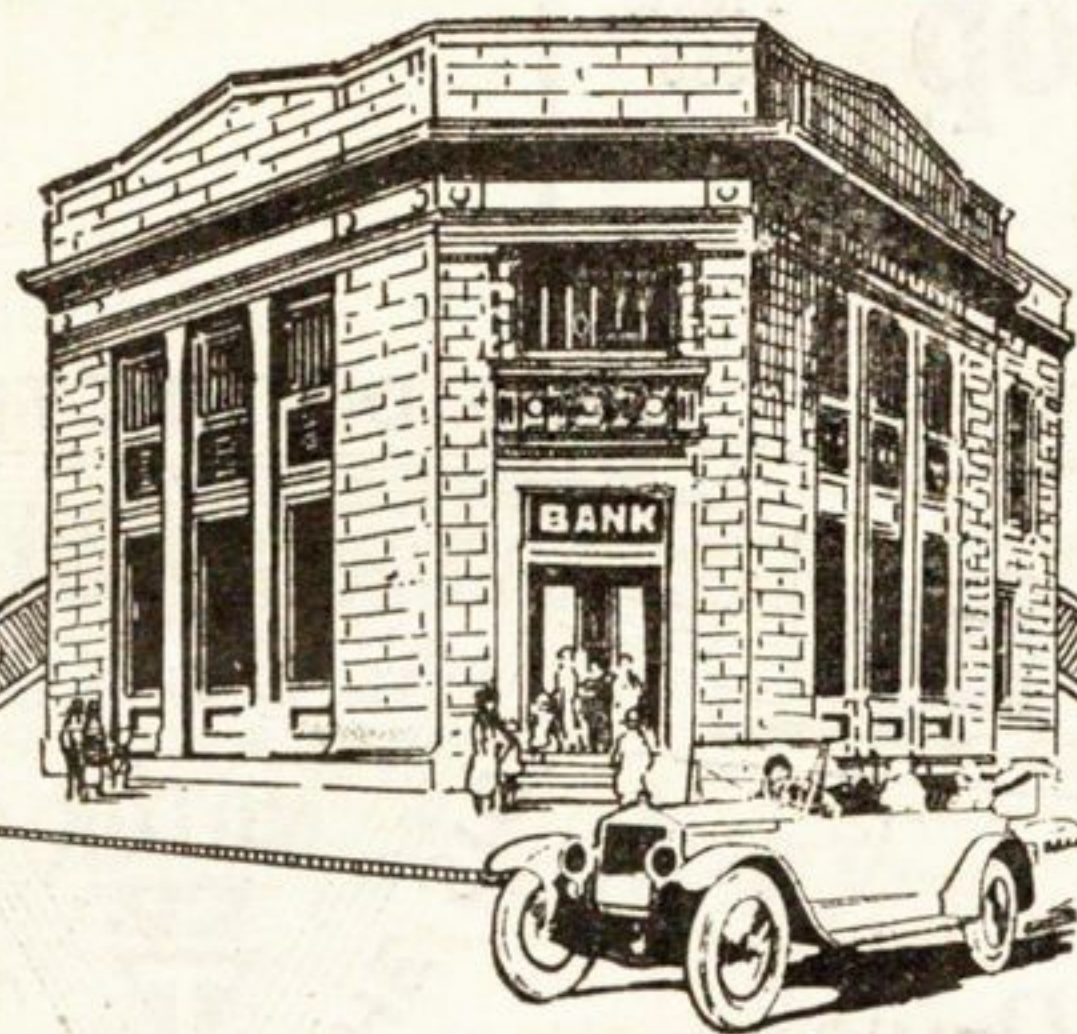
