holiday bill that should attract crowded houses. "Without Compromise," featuring Dustin Farnum, is the principal number on the film program.

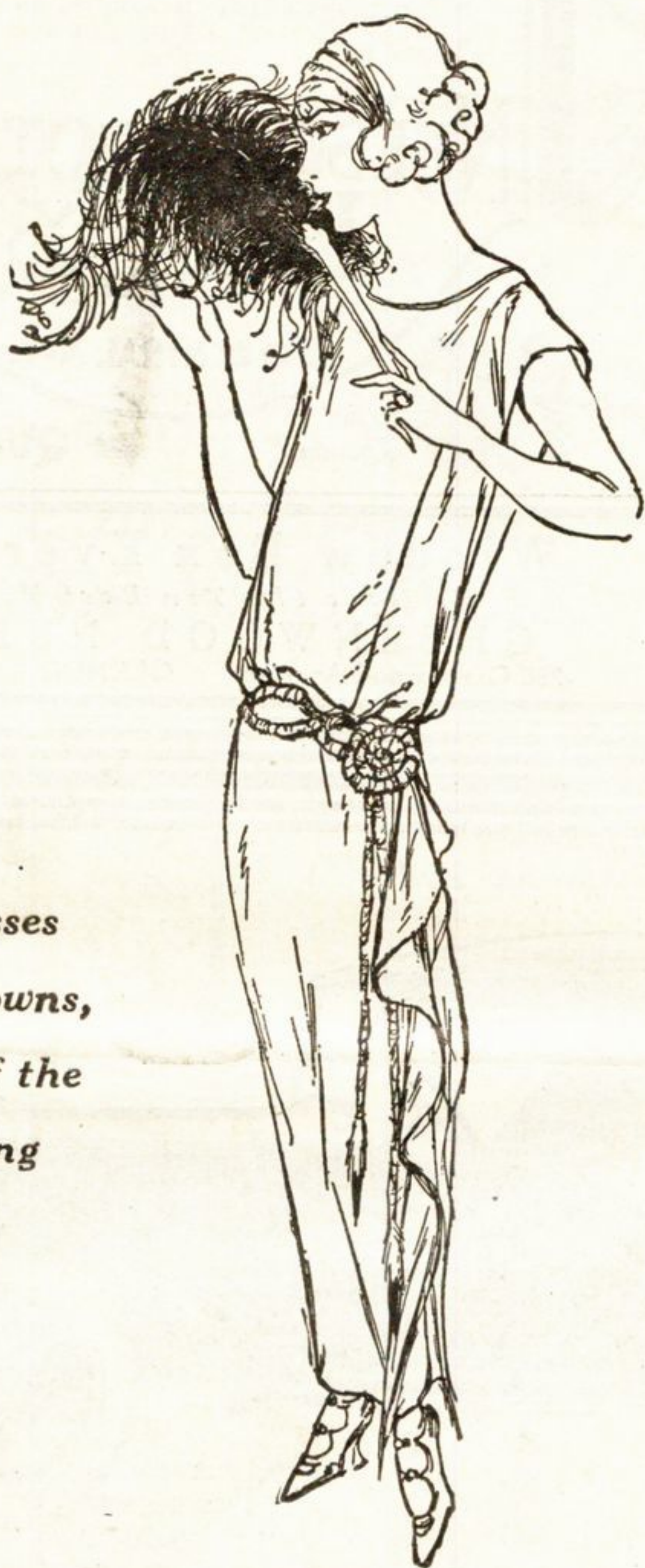
The picture for December 1 and 2 is "A Light in the Dark."

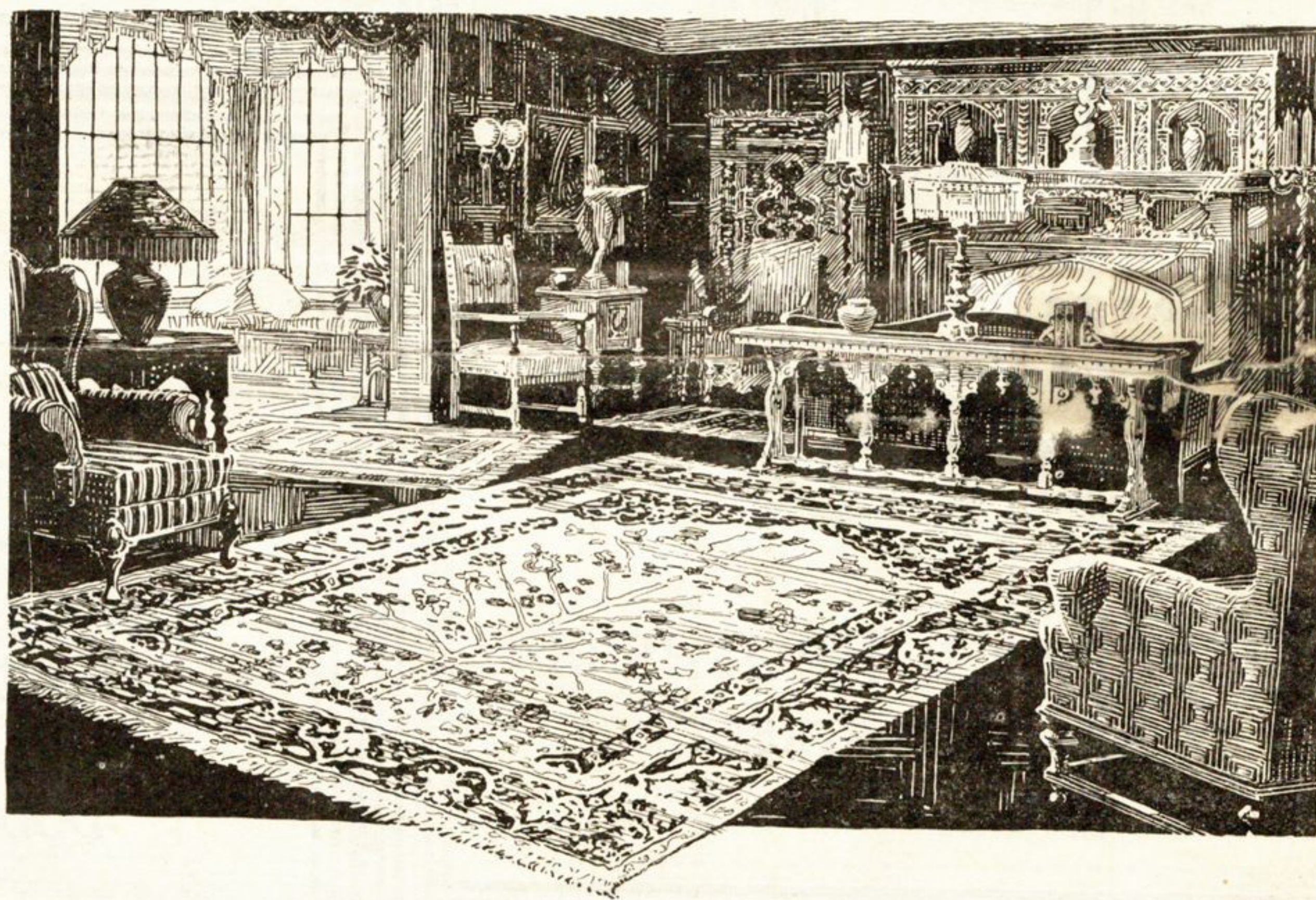
