

## NEED CLOTHING FOR ARDEN SHORE BOYS

Winnetka "Cargo" to Be Sent December 19

Tuesday, December 19, Winnetka will send a consignment of clothing to the Arden Shore Rest Camp near Lake Bluff, Ill.

The clothing is being donated by Winnetka residents in response to an urgent appeal sounded last week, setting forth the need for warm clothing, principally shoes, overshoes, sweaters, helmets and stockings, for the undernourished working boys who are placed in the camp to "get built up" physically for their duties as household providers.

All the boys in camp are listed on the records of the Chicago Board of Education as physically unfit to secure working certificates. They are taken from the tenement districts and kept at the camp until quite well. Hundreds of working boys are treated at the camp each winter and there is always the need for clothing, as well as games, books and other similar articles of interest to boys.

There is still opportunity to contribute to the "cargo" going to the camp next Tuesday. Mrs. Marcus D. Richards, 806 Rosewood avenue, is taking care of Winnetka contributions.
