The eleven o'clock service held on Christmas Eve at the Kenilworth Episcopal church was very well attended.

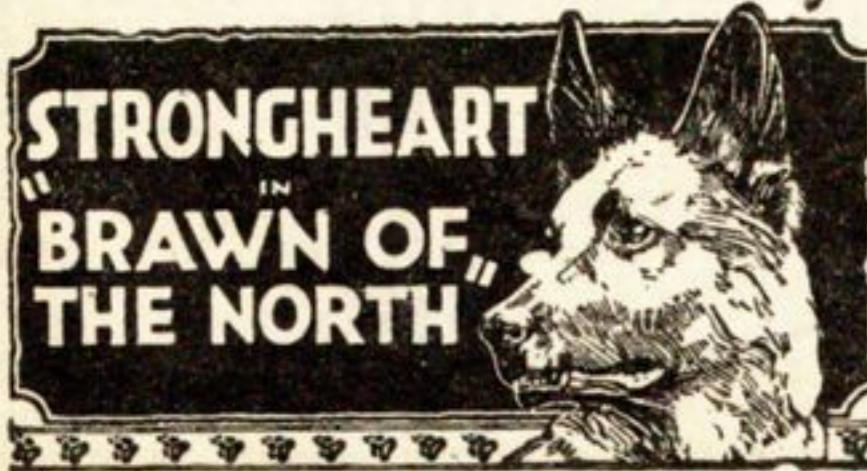
## Girl Scouts Will Inspect Wild Flower Art Exhibit

No longer do the booming beat of the tom-tom or the musical tones of the tribal crier summon the swarthy sons and daughters of the famous South Sea Islands to their festive gatherings, says the Brooklyn Citizen. The telephone has finally made its way into the great Pacific archipelago and has come to stay in the little Kingdom of Tonga.

The telephone system just installed in Tonga is one of the smallest in the world, consisting of a little less than 100 subscribers on the main island of the group. The mystery of the "talking wire" has caused much excitement among the natives.

## WHAT IS PASTEURIZATION?

Pasteurization, as defined by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, consists of heating milk to a temperature not higher than 145 degrees Fahrenheit and not less than 142 degrees for a period not less than thirty minutes, and after being bottled should be promptly cooled to 50 degrees F. or lower.
