

HOLD CONFERENCES ON RELIGIOUS LIFE

Rev. Richards to Conduct Discussions

Tuesday evening, January 16, Rev. James A. Richards of the Winnetka Congregational church will open a series of four conferences to be held in the Assembly room of Community House on the general subject of "Personal Religion."

The object of the course is two-fold—to train Christians for personal work and to answer some of the central questions asked by persons contemplating church membership.

On January 16 the discussion will be upon "Personal Work," its place in the religious life, worthy and unworthy motives in attempting it, and methods of accomplishing it. On January 23 the general subject will be the question Who belongs in the Church? This will of course require a discussion of the fundamental nature of the Christian life and its relation to creeds and to ethics. On January 30 the general theme will be the nature of the church and in particular just what sort of a church this is, and on February 6 methods of uniting with the church will be discussed and an effort made to summarize the course. It is planned to make a question box a prominent part of the series and oral questions as well as written will be encouraged.
