Thursday, Feb. 1, 10:30 to 12:30—all eighth period classes.

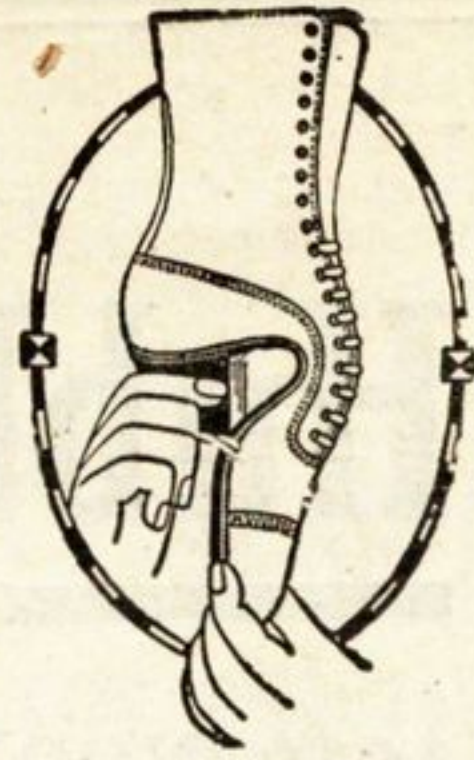
Thursday, Feb. 1, 10:30 to 12:30—all ninth period classes.

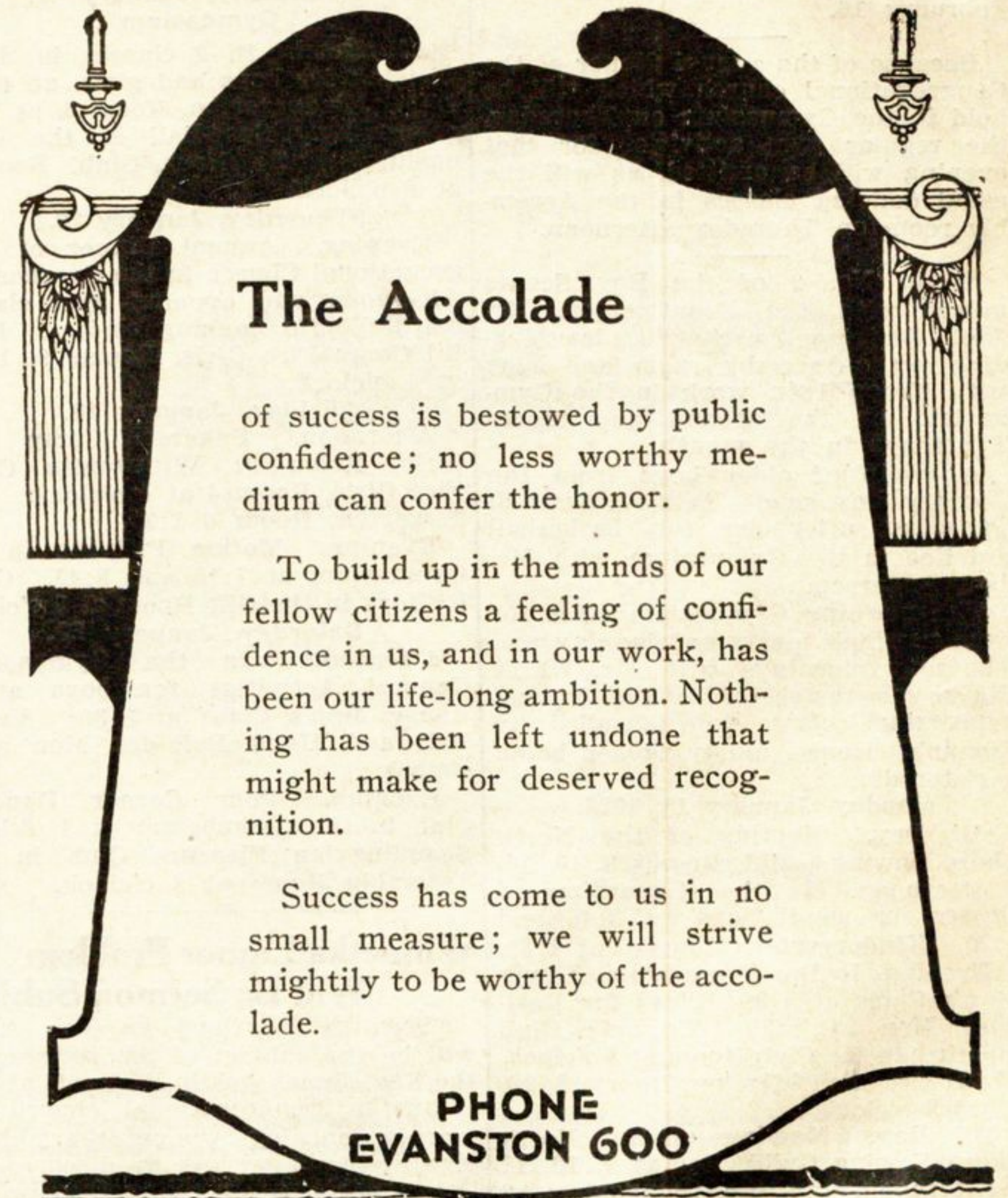

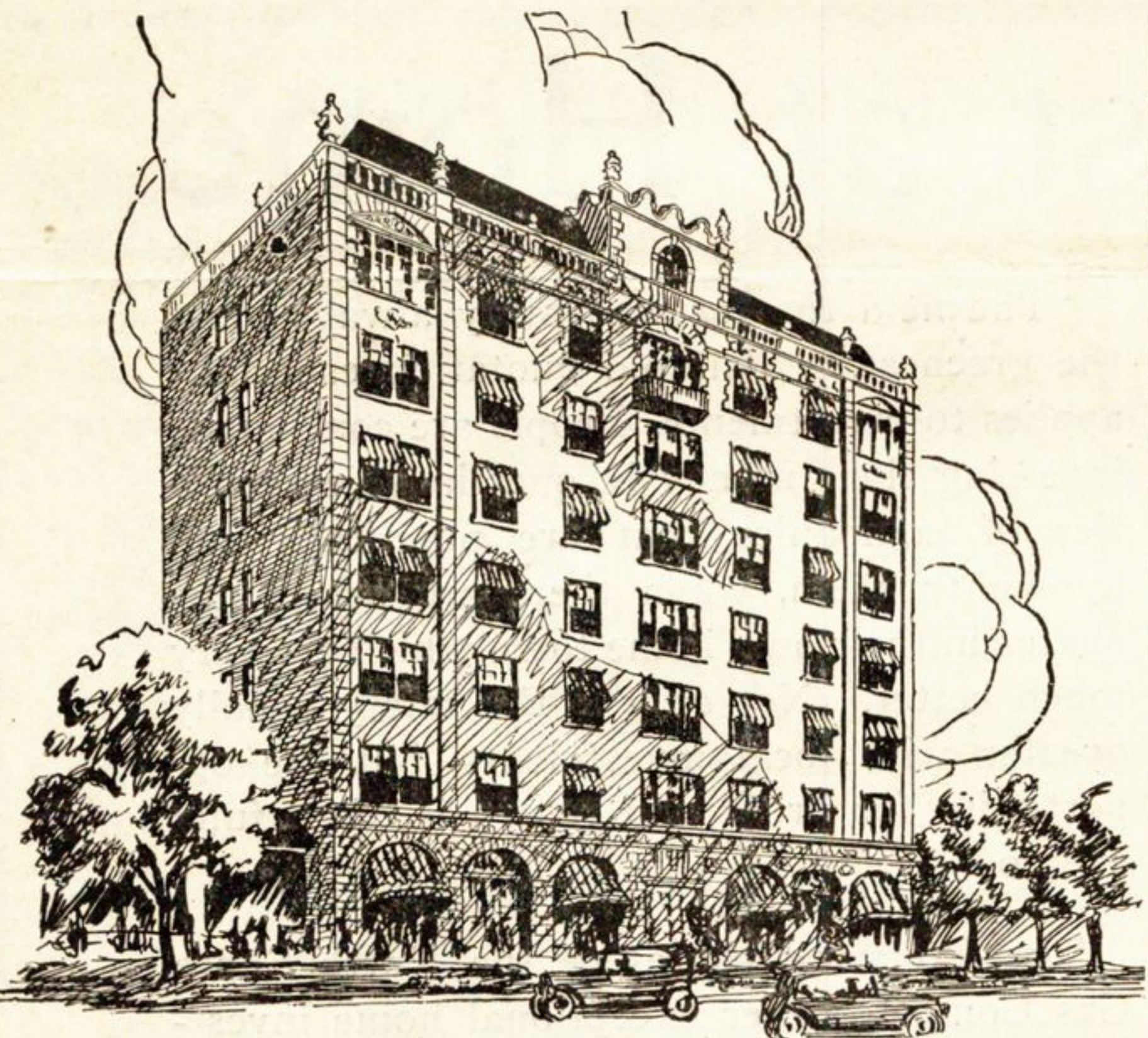
