

At The Metropolitan

The Metropolitan Museum has a most interesting and comprehensive course of lectures for this fall and winter. The courses are designed to meet the needs of people interested in various phases of art. Most of these lectures are free and open to the public.

A series of twenty-one lectures on Sunday afternoons comprises the following subjects, all of which are presented by men and women distinguished in these particular fields:

Royal Cortissoz, art editor of the New York Tribune, and the author of many books on art subjects, will give a series of lectures on "The Genius of American Art." The subject of interior decorations in Italy, France, England, and America will be discussed by Charles R. Richards of the Cooper Union, William M. Odom of the New York School of Fine and Applied Design, Francis Lengyon, and Fiske Kimball of the University of Virginia. Another group of these Sunday lectures will present the subjects of the Louvre, the British Museum, and the Metropolitan Museum. Design in its relation to paintings and architecture, the contribution of art to the stage, to the city, and to printing are other subjects which will be presented in this series of Sunday lectures.

Another series of lectures on Saturdays will deal with the subjects of architecture, sculpture, and painting

from early Egyptian times through the Greek, Roman, and Mediaeval periods to the Renaissance in France and Italy. These subjects will be presented by members of the faculties of Princeton, Harvard, Columbia, Smith, and Wellesley, and by members of the staff of the museum. Gallery talks on the collections in the museum will be given on Saturdays and Sundays. Special classes for teachers and pupils of the grade and high schools are arranged to correlate with their school work.

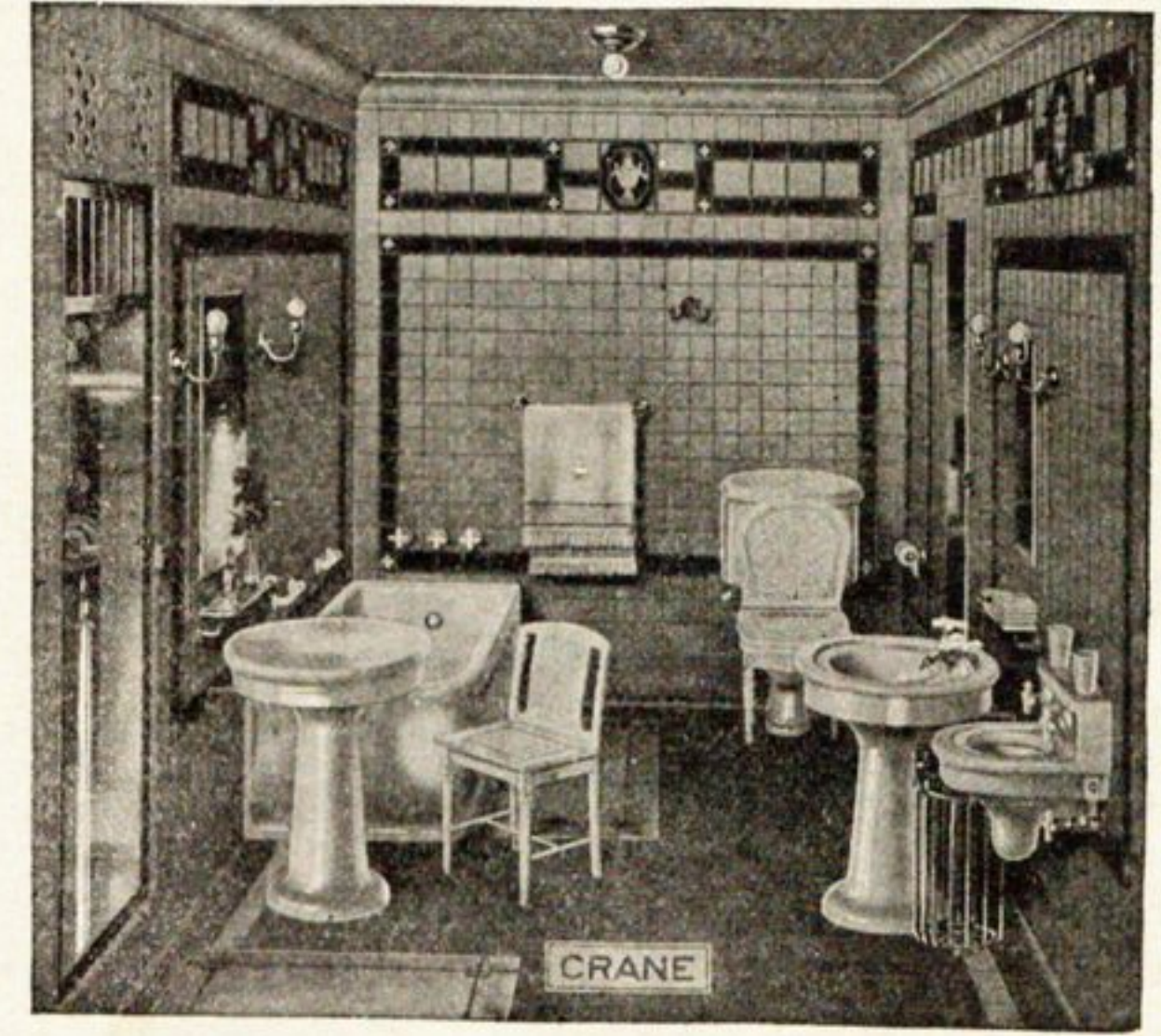
