ASSESSED VALUATION AND TAX LEVY FOR 1922

In another column will be found a statement of the 1922 assessed valuation and tax levy for Winnetka, Wilmette, Glencoe and Kenilworth, showing in detail the levy made by each taxing body in per cent of the assessed valuation.

In interpreting these figures, it should be borne in mind that the assessed valuation averages approximately twenty per cent of the actual cash value of real estate, so that the total tax rate for all purposes is approximately two per cent of the real value of property.

It will be noted from the schedule that the total tax rate for Winnetka, namely 10.46%, is lower than for Wilmette and Glencoe, that for Kenilworth being the lowest because of the low village rate. The levy of 2.05% by the Village of Winnetka for municipal purposes is distributed as follows:

The foregoing statement shows that the Village levy of 2.05% is but twenty per cent of the total tax paid. The total levy for village, school and park purposes is 8.12%, or approximately 80 per cent of the total tax.

H. B. Ryan Receives Permit for \$15,000 Residence Here
