The Winnetka Athletic Association announces a dance to be held at Community House, Saturday evening, February 24.

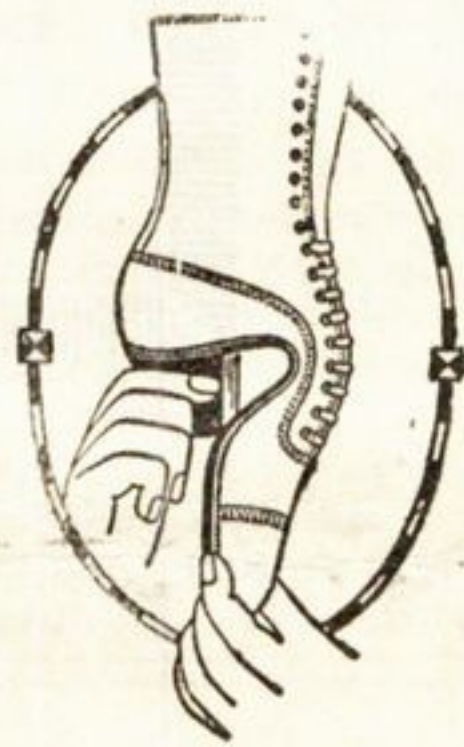
This social event is given by a group of young people in the village who are interested in the promotion of clean athletics, and the proceeds will be directed into a fund utilized to further that purpose.

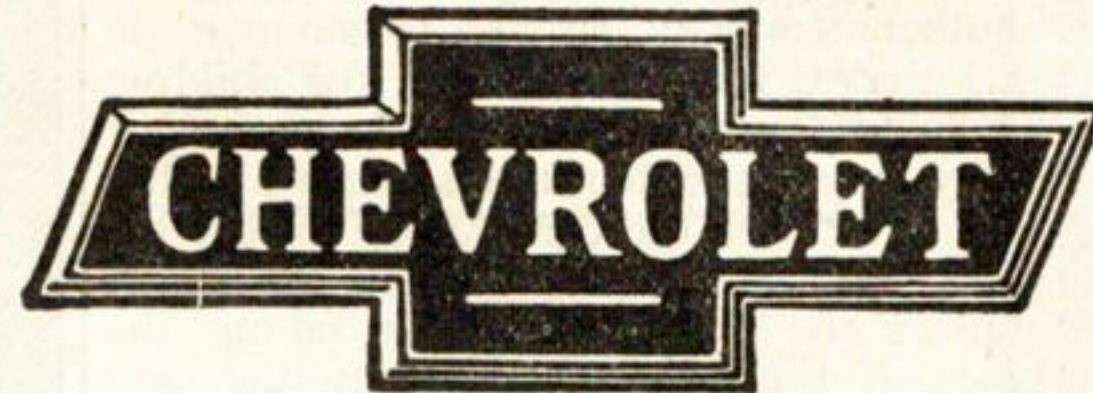

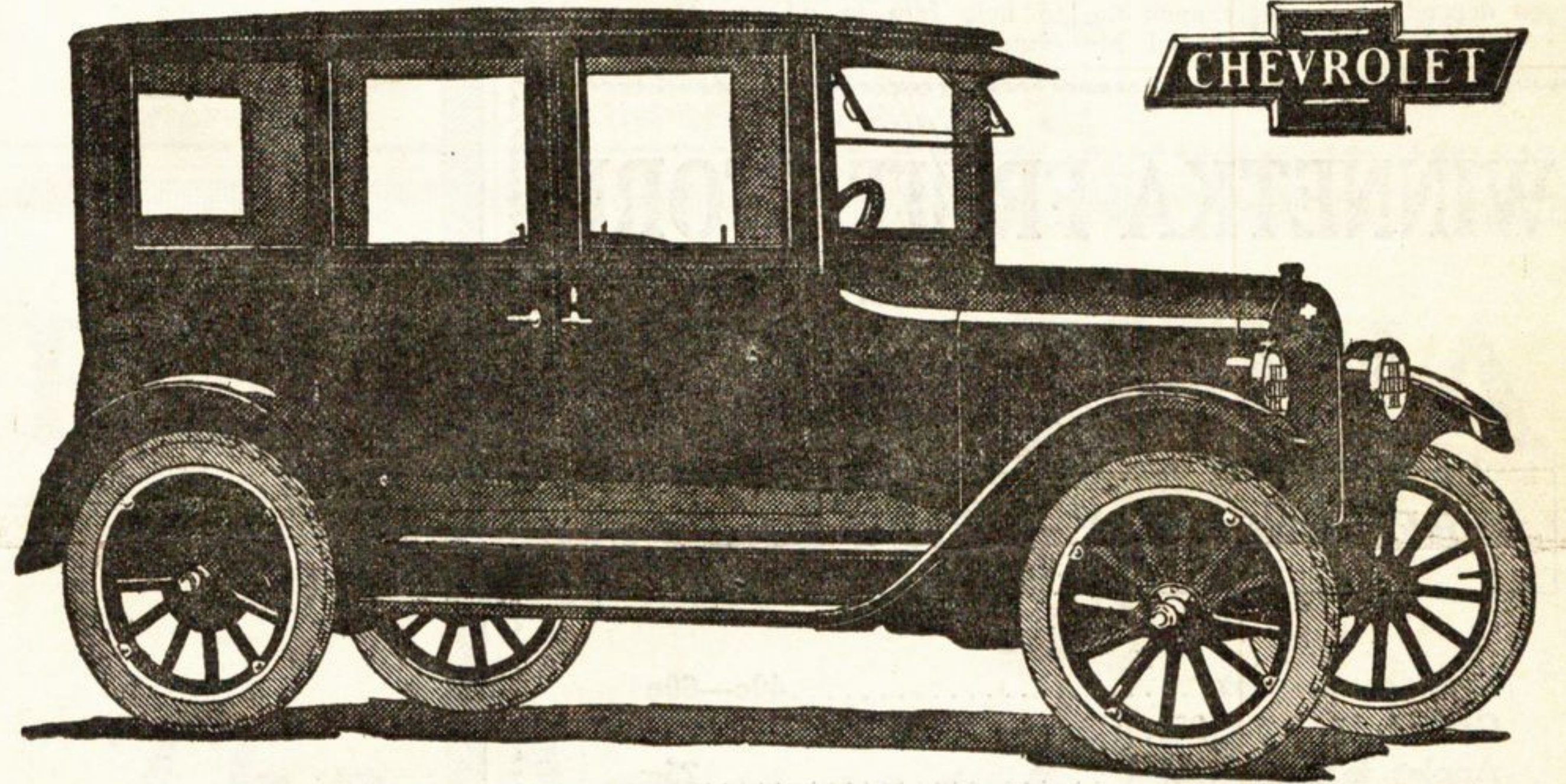
