The rain effect was produced by means for a small teeter-totter; the teeter part EMANCIPATING POWER of a small teeter-totter; the teeter part being built like a hollow box, the bottom of which was covered with wire netting. Inside of this box were several hundred of dried peas. By tipping this teeter-totter the peas were caused to roll along the screen thus producing the rain effect. Lightning was made by Shows Work Necessary For rubbing a file on a piece of carbon attached to an electric circuit. Two men were necessary in order to produce the thunder. One worked what is known as a thunder-sheet and the other a bass drum. The drum gave the crash while the thunder-sheet the roll that follows. Another man was necessary to work what is known as the dimmer: This caused the light to grow dim as the storm came up. And all of this phenomena had to be handled and timed to a nicety to co-ordinate with the movement of the play.
