Remedy Parking Condition At New Trier High School

Recent request by the Winnetka Village council that the New Trier High school board take steps to stop promiscuous parking of students cars in the vicinity of the school, this week brought response in a letter directed to the council by Edward J. Phelps, president of the High school board.

In the letter President Phelps stated that the high school administration had been advised to establish parking rules for the students and asked the Winnetka police to exert their powers to insure observance of parking regulations.

The letter stated further that students have been requested to restrict parking space to the north side of Winnetka avenue between Woodland avenue and Essex road, diagonal parking to be the rule. Also, parking will be permitted on the

west side of Essex road, parallel with the curbing.

Village Manager Woolhiser was authorized by the council to formulate a feasible plan to regulate parking near the High school.
