Sebastian Hinton, well known Chicago attorney, who resided at 950 Fig street, passed away unexpectedly Sunday, April 29, at Stockridge, Mass., a victim of heart disease. Mr. Hinton has been ill for some time, was on his way to his old home in the east for a rest.

Mr. Hinton is survived by his widow, Mrs. Carmelia Chase Hinton and three children. Services were conducted in Stockridge.

Mr. Hinton was especially active in Christ church parish as well as in the community life at large. He was one of the most diligent workers in the interests of the new Skokie public school and his wise counsel and enthusiasm were a potent factor in making possible a public school built entirely upon public subscription. His passing is mourned generally throughout the village.

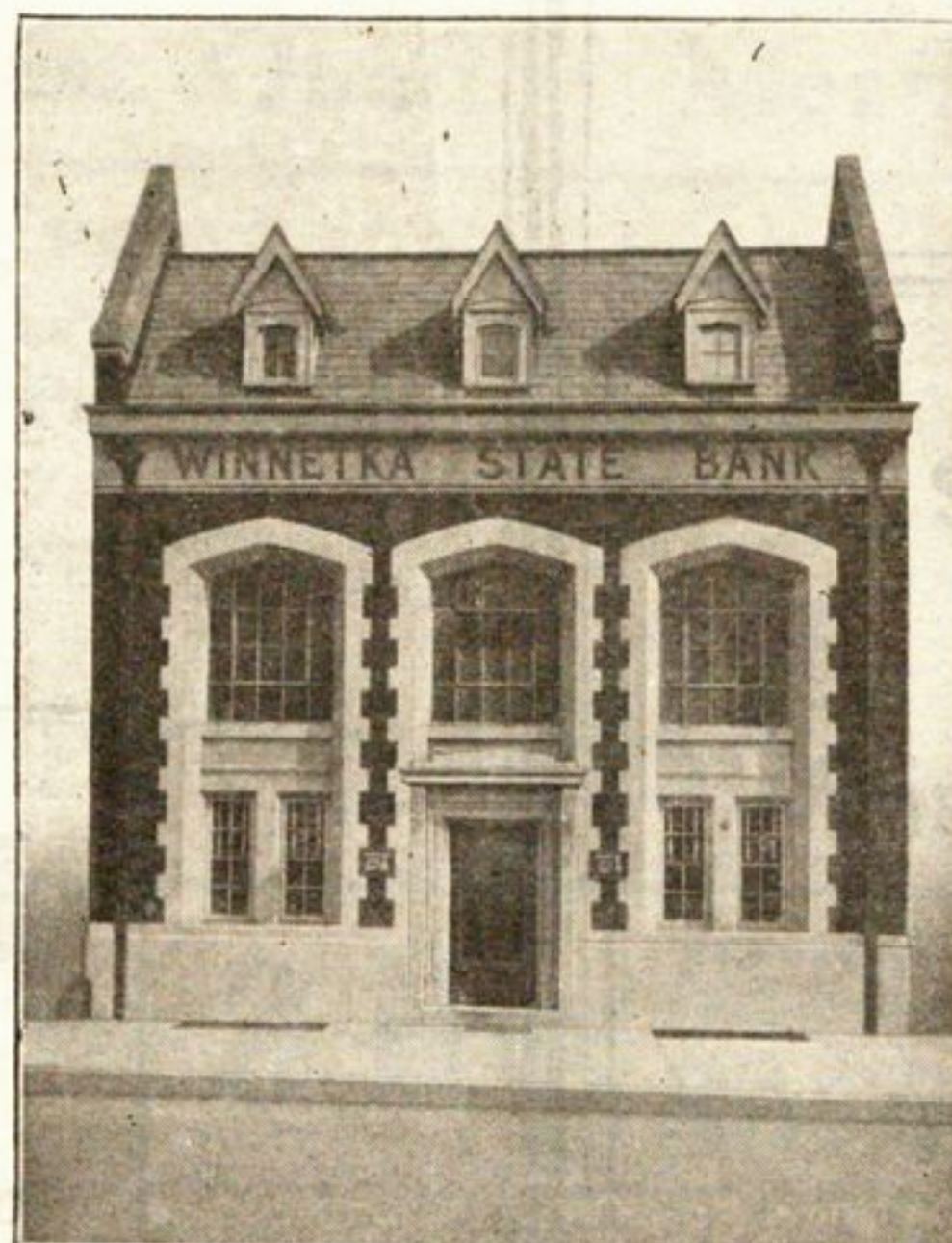
