

## FIFTH GRADERS PRESENT DRAMA

### Give Remarkable Performance of "Buddha"

Ancient history was made to live vividly at the Skokie school Tuesday afternoon of this week when Greeley school children took their original play, "Buddha," to the Jane Kuppenheimer auditorium and entertained the children of the other schools.

The play was a remarkably finished effort for fifth grade children, who, for forty-five minutes, presented with unmistakable enjoyment and unaffected simplicity, three vivid scenes in the early life of Buddha.

The palace of the Rajah, the street bazaar scene, the oriental dancers, even the snake-charmer, were all there, and in colorful costumes dyed and made, for the most part, by the little players.

"Buddha" is one of a series of history plays being worked out in the Elementary schools of Winnetka under the direction of Miss Douglas Whitehead, supervisor of dramatics. Miss Reine Bubbett, fifth grade teacher in Greeley school, co-operated with Miss Whitehead in giving the play.

The beauty and reality of the scenes was much enhanced by a number of genuine oriental properties loaned by parents.
