A \$2,000 permit was issued to George Park. He will finish two apartments in the second floor of the building at 566 Center street.

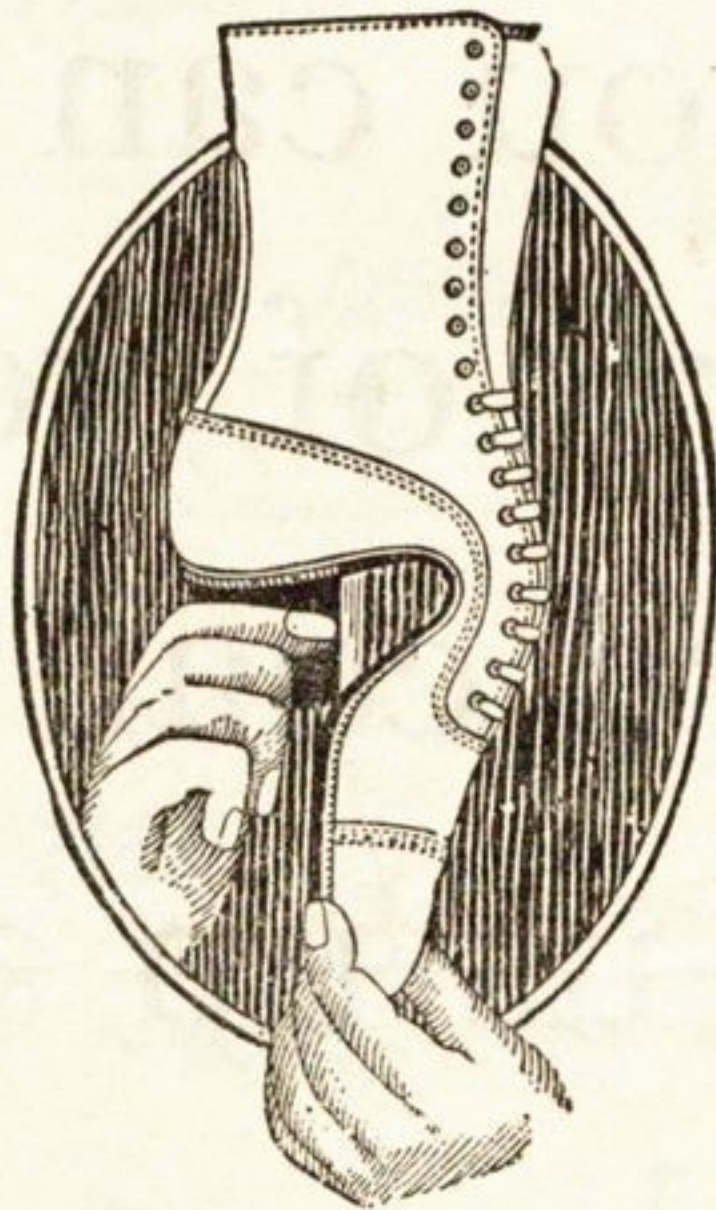
