LOCAL WOMEN IN SWIMMING CLASS

Four Hundred North Shore People Take Lessons

Four hundred north shore residents have enrolled themselves as members of the annual swimming class at Northwestern university under the coaching of Tom Robinson, the university swimming teacher. There are also sixty faculty members and forty-five students, making a total of over 500, a record for this, the thirteenth annual summer class. Of the 500, sixty per cent are children of 14 years and under. Already many of the embryo swimmers are able to progress through the water with the aid of "wings," and at the conclusion of the course, August 18, Coach Robinson expects to have everyone of his pupils, not only an expert swimmer but a life-saver besides. He is concentrating his instruction on the tread and crawl strokes in

classes and by the end of two weeks the swimmers will be able to dispense with their wings." Two days have been set aside for stunts and exhibitions. On July 4 at 10 o'clock in the morning there was a life-saving and swimming exhibition in the pool in the Patten gymnasium, and on August 18, there will be races and games; already Coach Robinson has received applications from one hundred and fifty men, women and children. Special instruction is being given to the business women, their class meeting every Tuesday and Thursday evening.
