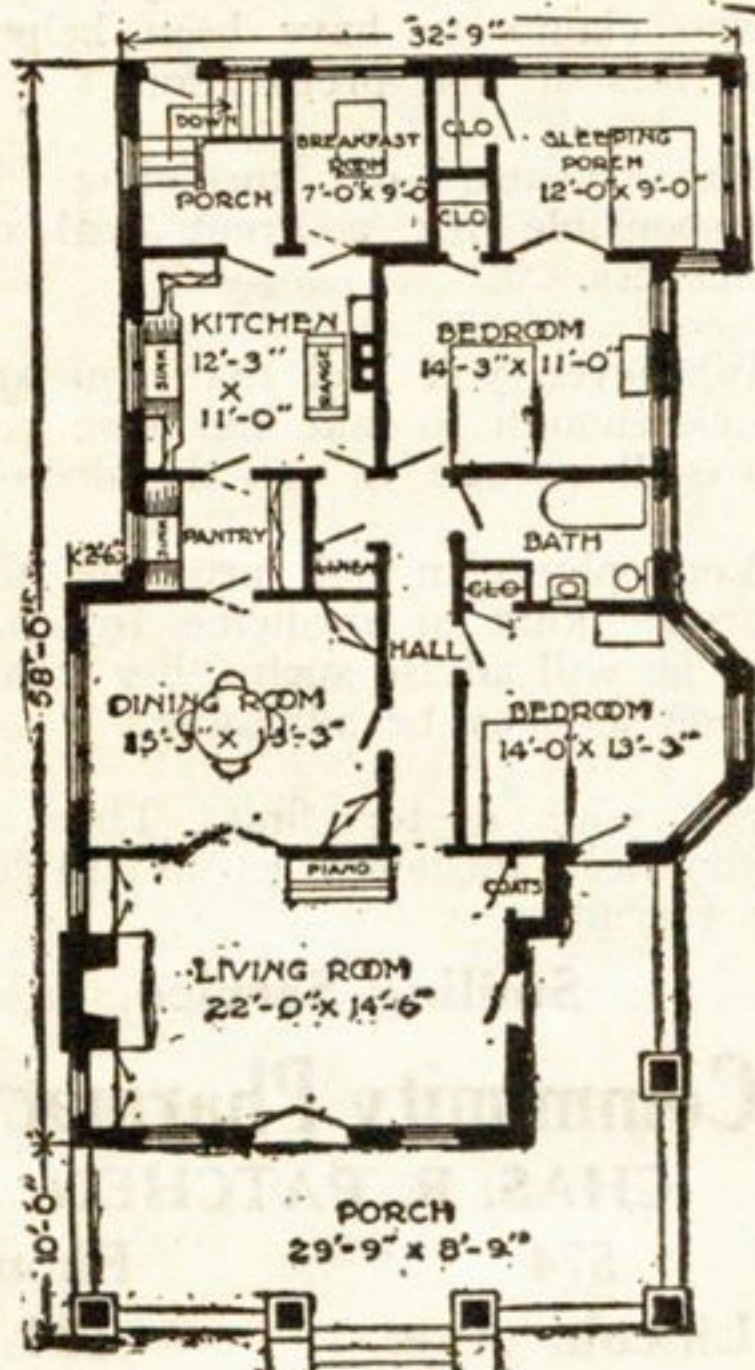
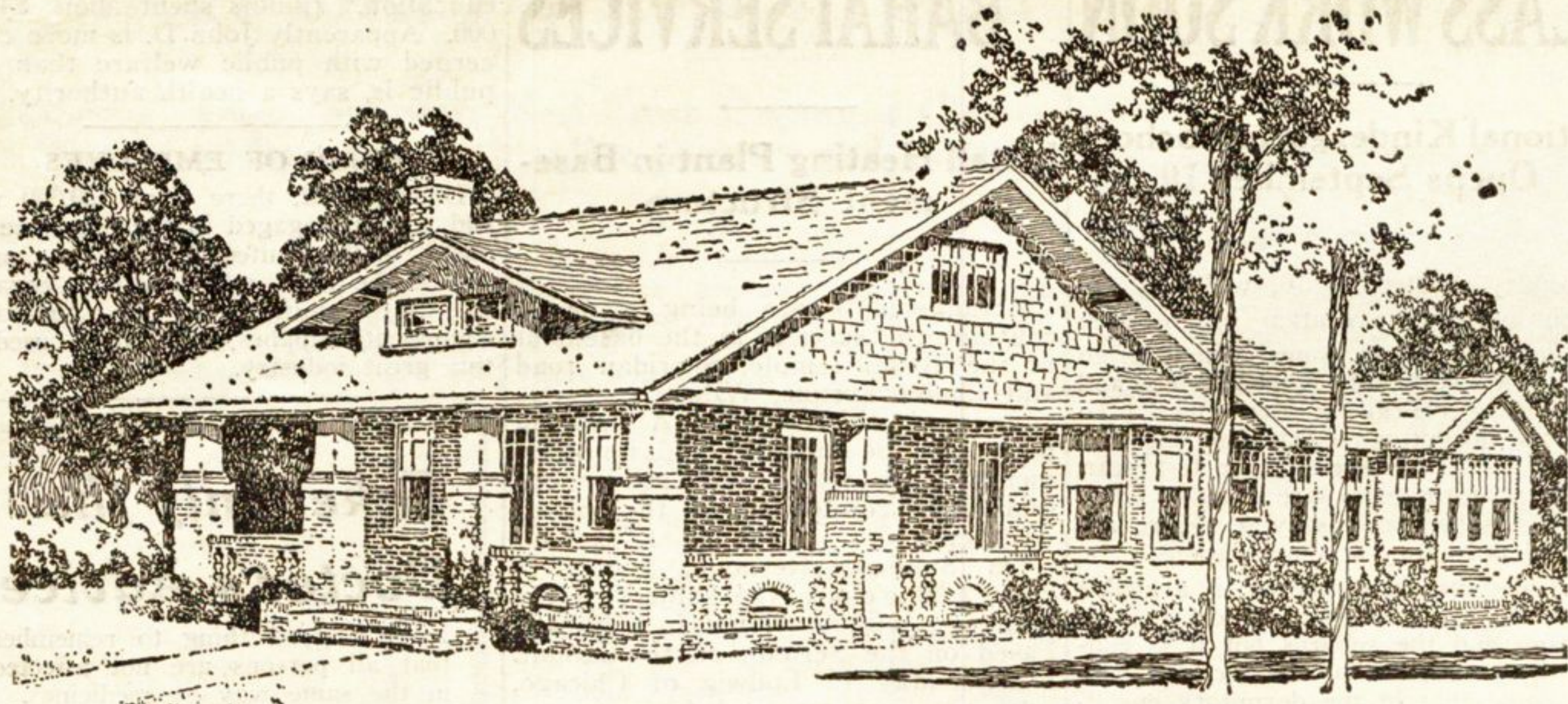
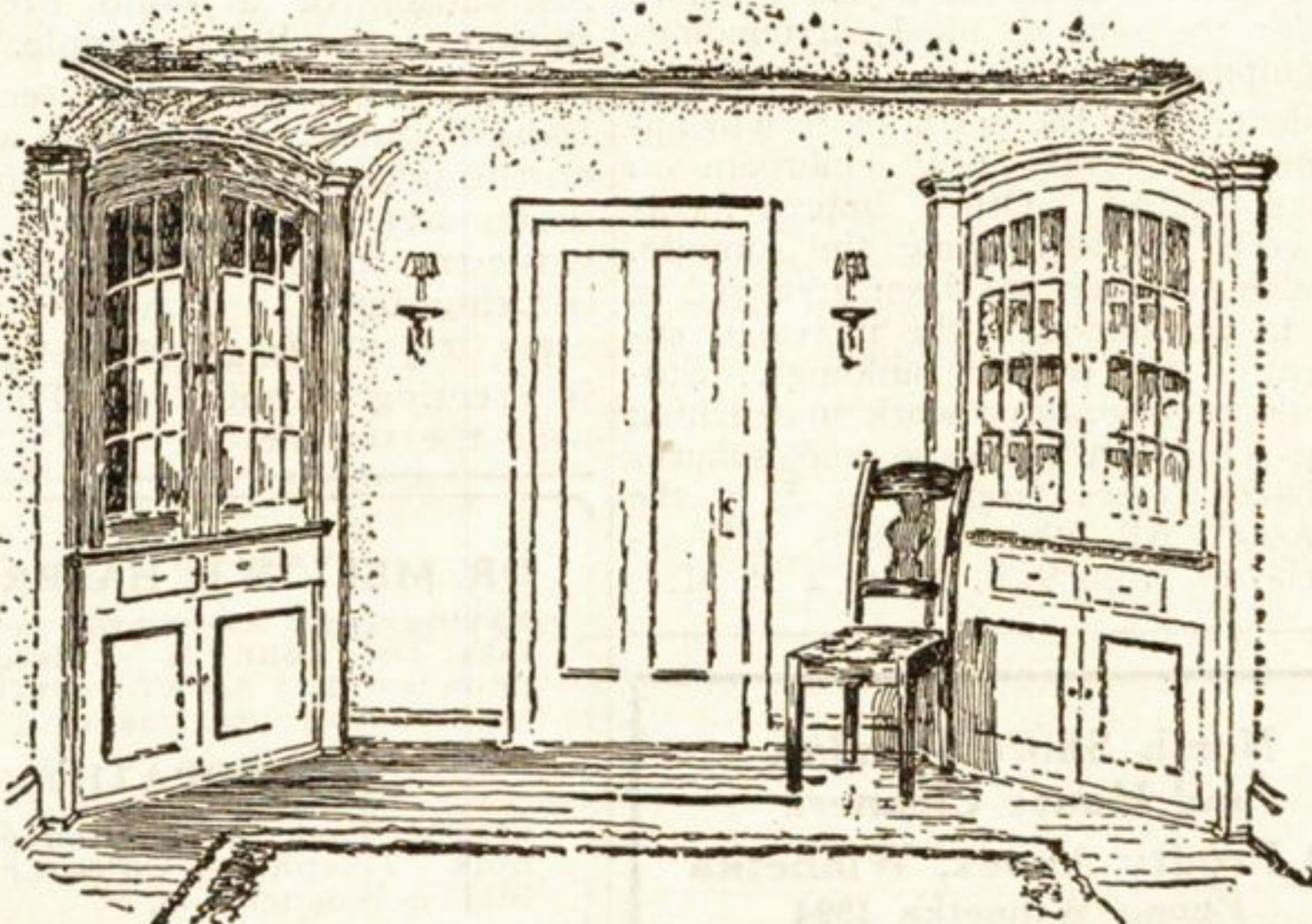


Bungalow of Decided Western Style

The wide-spread gables, the dormer, the over-hanging eaves, the low, broad porch suggests protection from the summer sun which is always grateful. While the attic might, on occasion, be fitted up as a low room, its chief function is to provide ventilation and insulation from the heat.

The porch is very pleasingly with its low, rambling sweep. The porch in this case is made somewhat more secluded by the pleasing brick parapet which would lend itself to very artistic treatment.

The living room, occupying the entire front of the house, is accessible from the porch either on the front or side. The fine brick hearth is flanked by bookcases which suggest delightful winter evenings.

The dining room is entered through folding doors from the living room or through the hall, and opens to the kitchen through a pantry, with cupboards and

also butler's sink, which, if desired, could be converted into a breakfast alcove leaving the present breakfast room for other purposes. The ample kitchen has all modern conveniences and an enclosed service porch.

The sleeping quarters—two bedrooms, a sleeping porch and the bath room—are secluded. The sleeping porch can do duty the year round for it is entirely glazed and has a good closet.

The basement is provided with laundry, heating apparatus, vegetable cellar, and proper storage space, but may be restricted in area at the option of the builder. The ceiling height is 8 feet 6 inches and the content 38,000 cubic feet.

Altogether this is an unusual house, both outside and inside, but above all it is decidedly a comfortable and convenient house to live in.

Will Be Ready for Big Homecoming Game

Through the generosity of the alumni and students of the University of Illinois who are giving \$2,000,000 for a memorial stadium, for the first time all the people of the state who desire will be able to see the big football games at the state university.

Although the stadium will not be entirely completed this season, all of its 55,000 seats will be ready for the opening November 3, the annual homecoming, when Chicago and Illinois will play. Heretofore it has been almost impossible for others than alumni and students to obtain seats for the homecoming game, but from now on there will be seats for everybody.

Another important announcement is that there will be no limit on the number of tickets purchased by one person. Taking advantage of this, parties to attend the opening are already being organized all over the state.

Frank H. Beach, manager of ticket sales, is mailing out 19,000 application blanks and instructions to Stadium subscribers. This material will be sent to all others who request it. It is possible to order seats now for all of the home games at Illinois and many wise enthusiasts are doing this.

November 17—Miss. A. and M. in the Stadium.

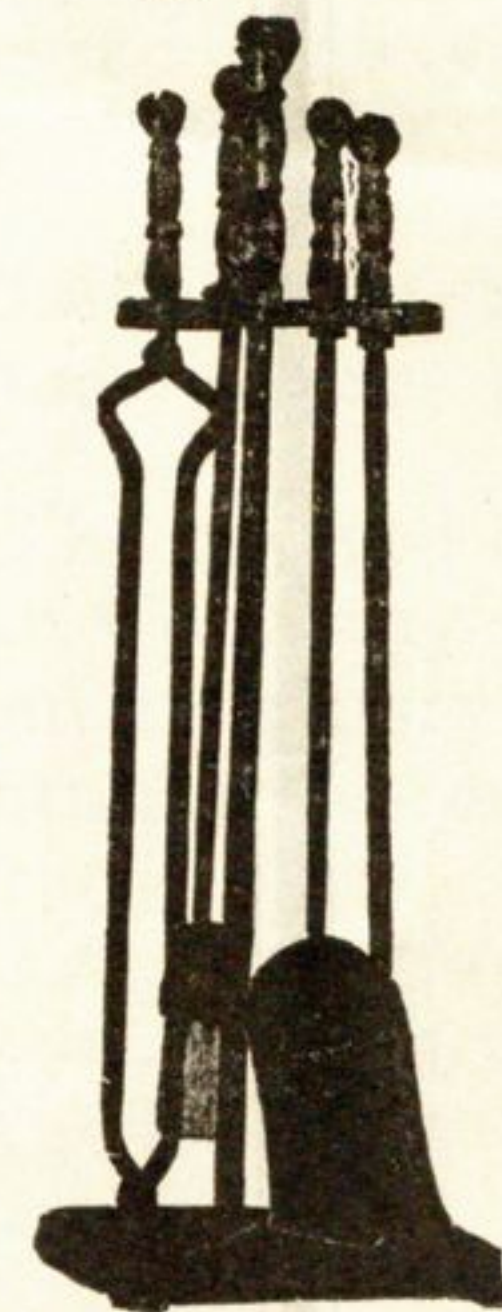
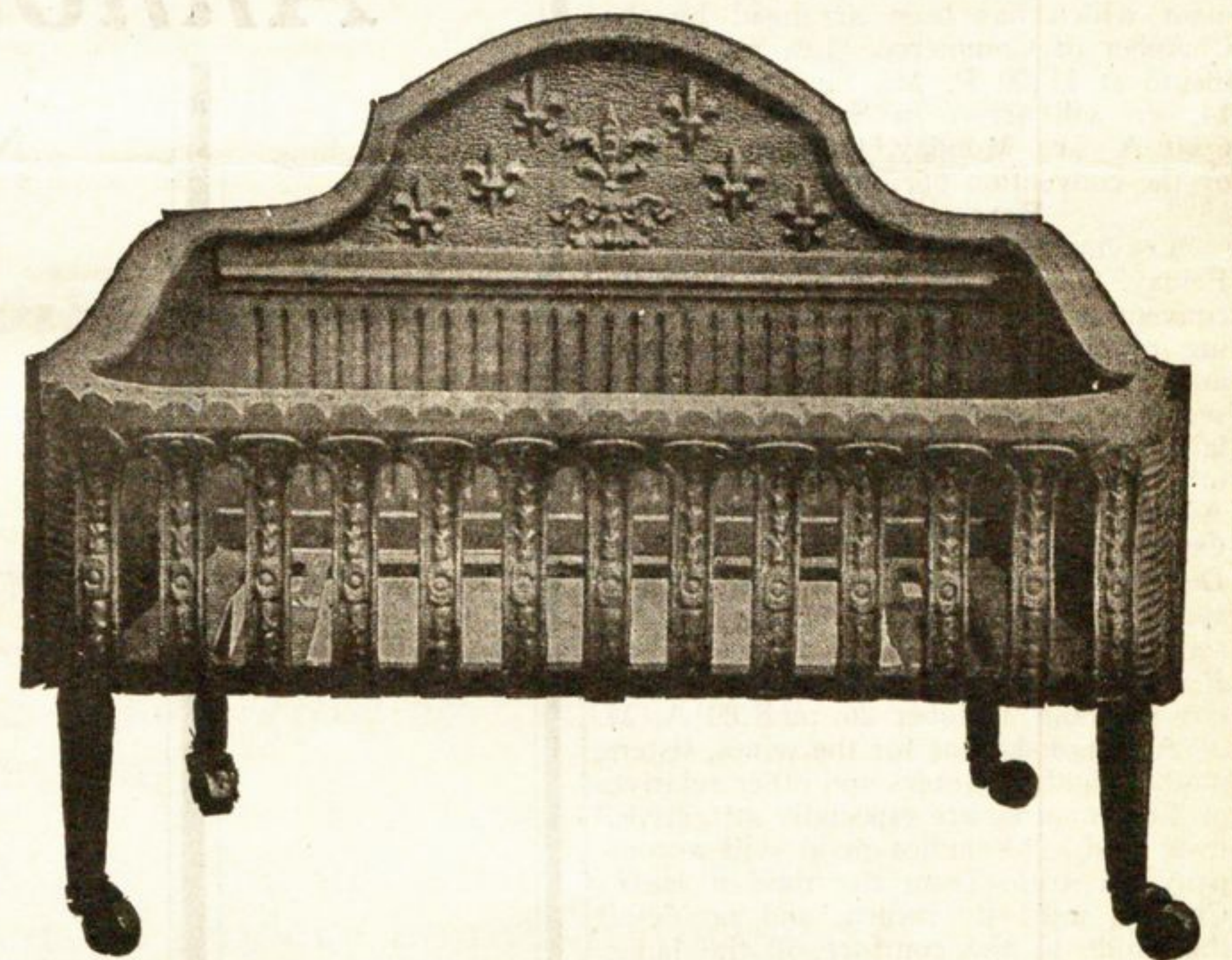
