

OPEN MISSION SCHOOL HERE

School Is Sponsored by Wilmette Baptist Church

The attention of the whole world just now is turned towards Japan. It is a matter of speculation in the minds of all the students of world affairs as to whether the recent catastrophe will effect the diplomatic relationships with Japan or not. Surely the prompt relief from America should serve as a bond of friendship between these two nations.

At this timely season, the Wilmette Baptist church is to conduct a School of Missions, beginning Wednesday night, September 26. The school as conducted is under the direction of the Board of Promotion of the church, of which Miss Annie S. Beach is chairman. Courses will be offered for adults, for young people and for children. The adult class will be held on Wednesday evenings, with the exception of October 17, from September 26 to November 7, at 8 o'clock, and will be taught by Professor Edmund D. Soper, Professor of Comparative Religions at Northwestern university. Dr. Soper was born of missionary parents in Japan, has made recent travels in Japan, and is the author of the most authoritative recent works in English on comparative religions entitled, "The Religions of Mankind." Dr. Soper is not only a profound scholar but a charming and popular teacher. The adult class will use as a basis for its study, a new book put out by the Missionary Education Movement entitled, "The Creative Force in Japan," by Galen M. Fisher.

The Young People's class will meet on Wednesday evenings—the same dates as the adult class—and will be led by Mrs. W. Carey Matthews, who took a special course in normal training at the Lake Geneva Missionary Education conference this past summer in preparation for her work. The young people will use the book entitled, "Japan on the Upward Trail" by William Axling, just off the press of the Missionary Education Movement.

The Children's course will be held on Wednesday afternoons at 3:30 o'clock, and will be under the direction of a corps of competent instructors. Object lesson work, pictures, and other modern methods of child teaching will be employed. The book to be used will be that recently published by the Missionary Education Movement entitled, "The Honorable Japanese Fan," by Margaret Applegarth.

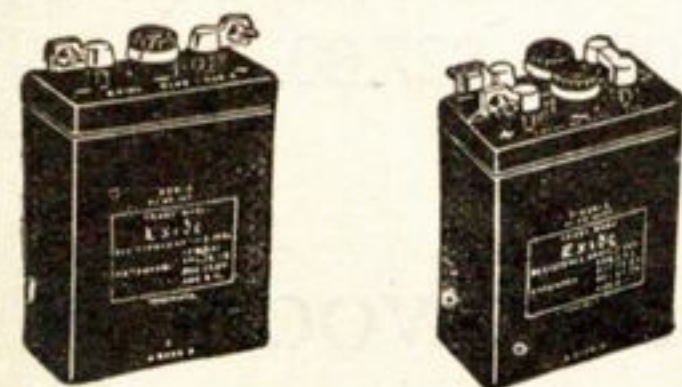

ALL READY FOR N. U.-"I" GAME

Cubs Park to be Scene—Seats Going Fast

All of the papers in the contract between officials of the Cubs Park and Northwestern University have been signed and the big game between Northwestern and the Illini the afternoon of October 27 is assured. Meanwhile Directors George Huff of Illinois and Dana Evans of Northwestern have discovered that by re-arranging the gridiron somewhat at each end there will be practically no abridgement of distance behind either goal-line save at one side of the field. This slight cutting-off will not be over two yards at its most and will taper quickly into regulation distance so that neither team should be embarrassed to any extent.

Tickets are still going at a good rate, according to E. B. Davidson, ticket manager of Northwestern University and Charles Ward, secretary of the alumni association. Illinois alumni have been sending in for seats at a lively rate, Mr. Davidson states, and now that the game is clinched for the Cubs park, Northwestern grads in large numbers are asking for reservations. A feature of the prospective football season at Northwestern, according to Mr. Davidson, is the practice of an increasing number of Purple alumni to reserve tickets for the home games for the entire season.

"Our alumni are discovering," explained Mr. Davidson, "that this practice insures them good seats for each and every game. Some of them want the same seats for all games and by reserving seats for a season, they obtain just what they want, avoid getting caught in the crowds at each game and have the assurance that they will have no trouble in reaching their places. Seats in the alumni section, however, are reserved until Thursday prior to each home game but it is easier if our thousands of grads would reserve for the season and thus insure the Purple team adequate backing for all its contests."

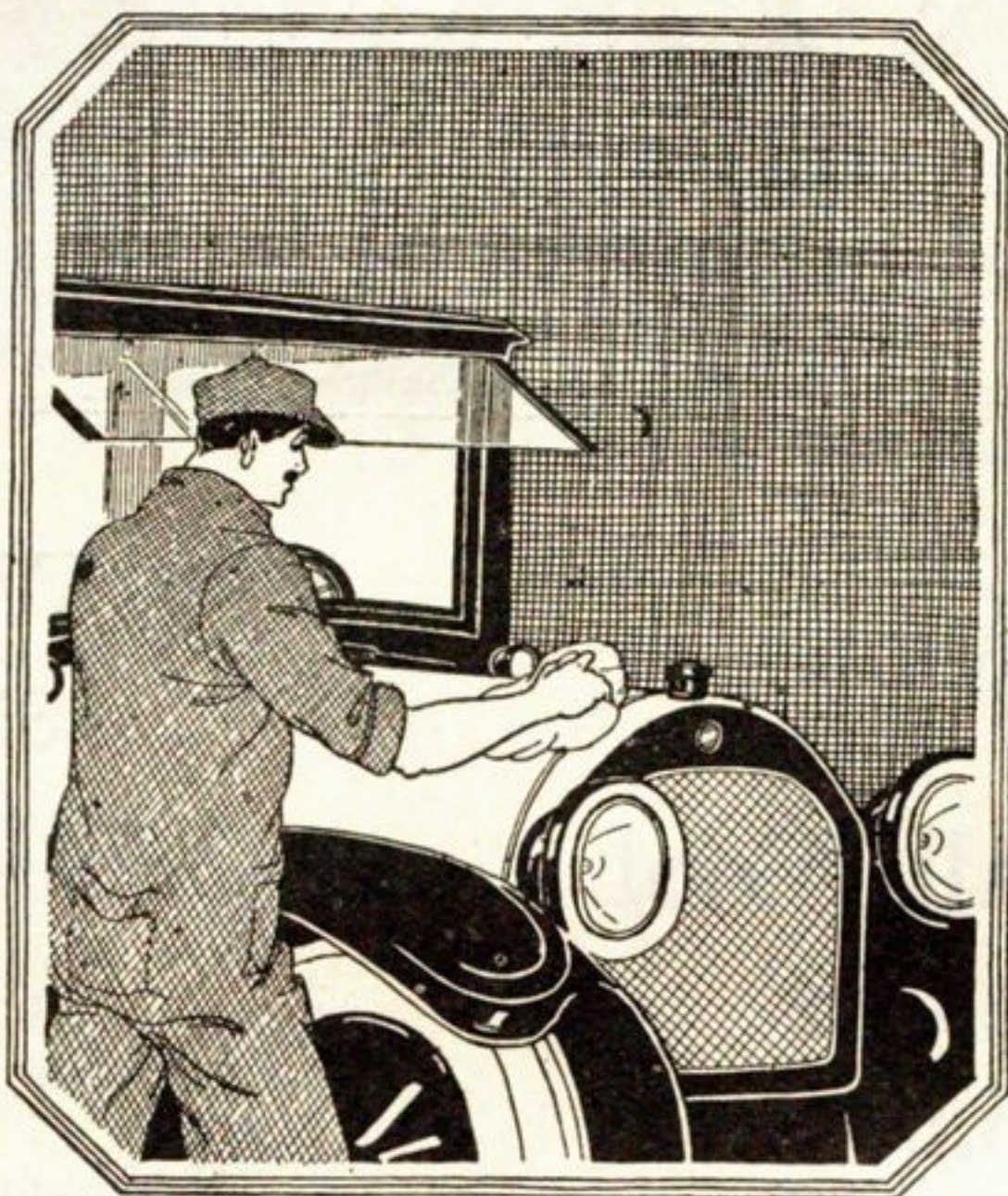
