

"13TH CHAIR" DRAMA COMING

**North Shore Players to Give
Production of Great Mystery Play This Season**

POLICY IS ANNOUNCED

**All Players Performances to
Aid Charity**

This week brings from the North Shore Players an announcement as to what their plans will be for the season, 1923-24. They were made known this week by Sidney M. Speigel, Jr., president of the Players. Mr. Speigel outlined the matter as follows:

"Last season we presented several productions, among which were: 'Peg O' My Heart' and 'The Three Live Ghosts.'"

"These plays were entirely different and each showed a different phase of the drama. 'Peg O' My Heart' was a true American play, in spite of the fact that the scenes were laid in England. It was the kind of a comedy that gets to an American audience's heart. While 'Three Live Ghosts' was an imported comedy. In other words an Englishman's side of the story. Both were comedies of the first rank, and we believe that each found its place into the hearts of our audiences."

"It has always been the North Shore Player's intention to give the people of the north shore what they wanted. We planned our campaign last year with this thought in mind, and, again, this season, we are still keeping this paramount in our thoughts."

Would Please Audience
"No matter what we are going to please our audiences. We are going to give them what we believe they want. If it is comedy they want, they are going to have it, even though we may have to revert to 'slap stick.' If it is drama they desire, they are going to get that. In other words, we are going to give the public what they want."

Decides On Mystery
"After a good deal of study in trying to find out what was wanted, I believe we have at last found the thing that north shore audiences desire. It is neither drama nor comedy, but a mixture of both, together with an uncertain thing added to it which is known as mystery. In other words, in the new play which we have chosen we are going to have comedy, drama and thrills galore. We are going to make them laugh, and we may make them cry, and we are sure we are going to make their 'hair stand on end.' The play we have chosen for this purpose is 'The Thirteenth Chair,' by Baynerd Weiller, author of 'Within The Law.' 'The Thirteenth Chair' has proven to be the most popular play ever written by Mr. Weiller."

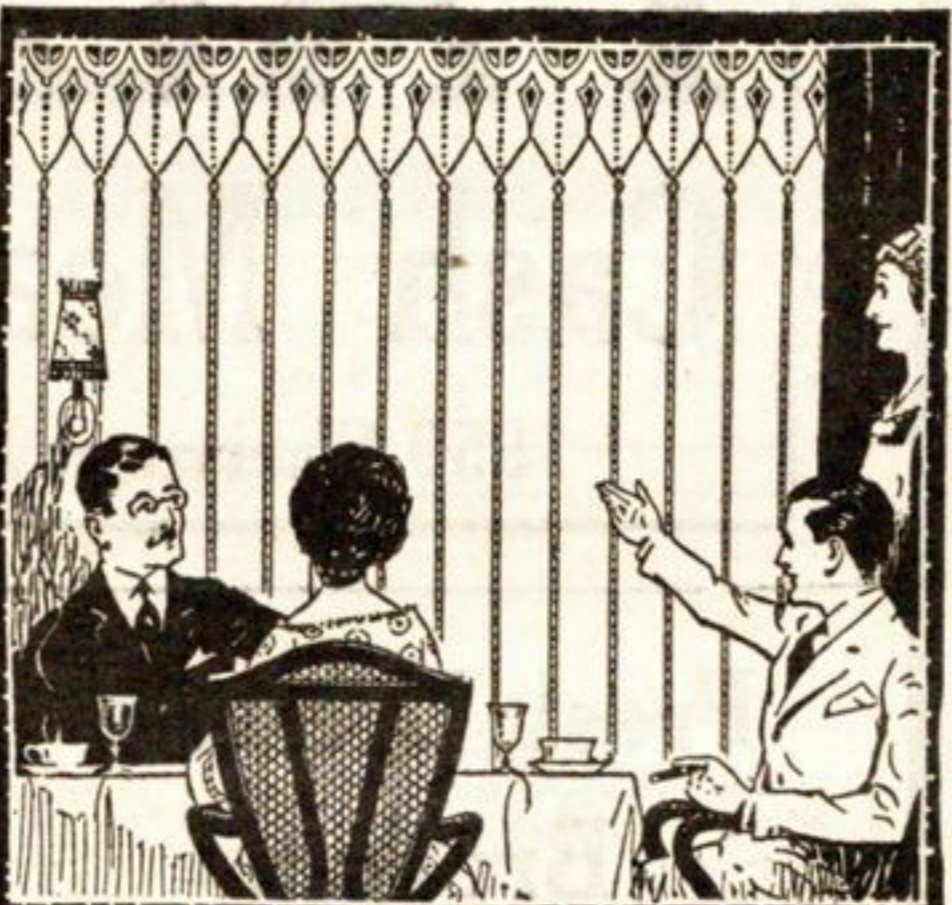

Winnetka, Illinois, Sept. 29, 1923.
Notice is hereby given that sealed bids for the construction of the following improvement:

For the improvement of OAK STREET from and connecting with the present pavement at the west line extended of Glendale Avenue to a line parallel with and twenty-two (22) feet west of the east line extended of Hibbard Road; also CHERRY STREET from and connecting with the present pavement at the east line extended of Glendale Avenue to a line parallel with and twenty-two (22) feet west of the east line extended of Hibbard Road; also GLENDALE AVENUE from and connecting with the present pavement at the south line extended of Oak Street to and connecting with the present pavement at a line parallel with and twenty-two (22) feet south of the north line extended of Willow Street, including the three alleys returns on the east side of said Glendale Avenue as far back as the east line extended of Glendale Avenue, and excepting the pavement herein proposed at the intersections of said Glendale Avenue with Cherry Street and Ash Street; also BERKELEY AVENUE from and connecting with the present pavement at a line parallel with and twenty-two (22) feet north of the south line extended of Oak Street to and connecting with the present pavement at a line parallel with and twenty-two (22) feet south of the north line extended of Willow Street, excepting the pavement herein proposed at the intersections of said Berkeley Avenue with Cherry Street and Ash Street, by excavating, filling, grading, grubbing, rolling and preparing the subgrade to receive the proposed pavement, constructing brick masonry manholes, catch basins, manhole catch basins and a valve vault, constructing tile pipe drains, tile pipe culverts, Portland cement concrete tile

pipe culverts and concrete headwalls for culverts, adjusting present manhole covers and valve vault covers, removing trees, grading the parkways, and paving with a one (1) course reinforced Portland cement concrete pavement with integral curbs, protecting, curbing and integrating said pavement and connecting said proposed pavement with present pavements, including all trenching, backfilling, the removal of all surplus excavated materials, and cost of engineering services, all in the Village of Winnetka, County of Cook and State of Illinois, said improvement and assessment being otherwise known as Winnetka Special Assessment No. 392,764, in accordance with the ordinance heretofore passed therefor, will be received by the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Winnetka by or before eight o'clock p. m. on Tuesday, the sixteenth day of October, A. D. 1923, at which hour all bids will be opened at a meeting to be held in the Council Chamber of the Village Hall, in the said Village of Winnetka, Cook County, Illinois.

The specifications of said improvement are on file in the office of the Clerk of said Village of Winnetka. Contractors will be paid in bonds bearing interest at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum for all estimates approved by the Board of Local Improvements in the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and over when the amount of balance due on any estimate is less than the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), the same will be paid by time warrants. In addition to the usual bond for construction and maintenance in the sum equal to one-third of the amount of the bid accepted by the Board of Local Improvements, the successful bidder will be required to furnish an indemnity and defense policy in some reliable company indemnifying the Village of Winnetka against loss from liability for damages on account of injury or death suffered by reason of the performance of the work required to be performed by the said contractor, by any person or persons including such liability imposed under the employers' liability and workmen's compensation law of the State of Illi-

nois, and the amendments thereto, in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00).

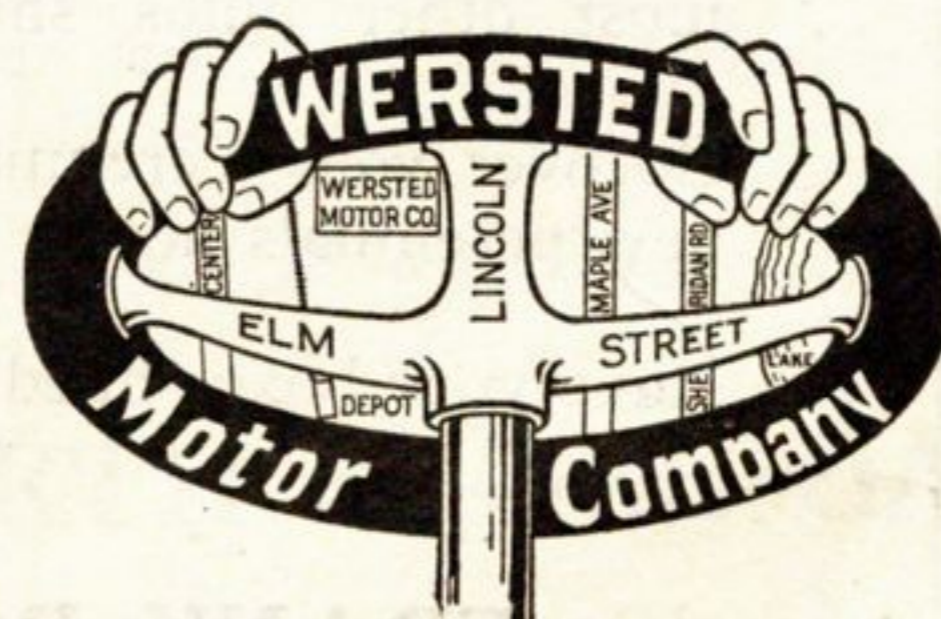
