JOINS GLEASON AND PERRIN

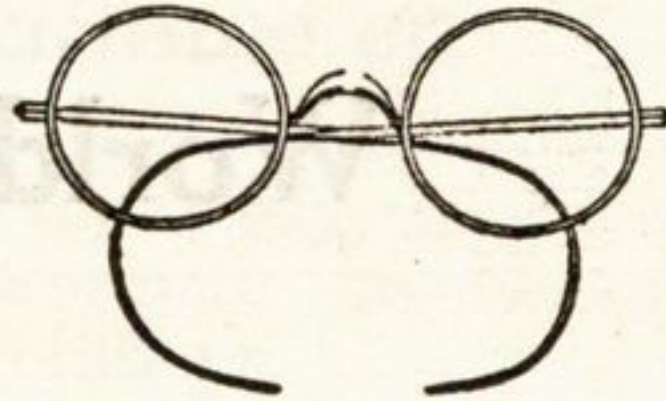
