# SUNDAY MARKS CLUB CLOSING

North Shore Golf Club For-sakes Old Site

The North Shore Golf club of Kenilworth, will be formally closed Sunday, November 11, at which time everything will be packed up and the club house locked for the winter.

On January 1, this property will be turned over to the Kenilworth Realty association, which purchased it last May. The land has been subdivided and large homesites are being rapidly sold to people who will build homes in the near future.

Foundation work on the new club house on West Lake avenue, Glenview, is already started. Planning of the greens was completed early in the fall and they will be ready for play on the opening day, May 1, 1924, by which time it is expected the club house will be completed for the big opening events.

The home-site property near the new course, which comprises a 50-acre tract, situated directly south and across the Glenview road from the new North Shore club house, is now being laid out by landscape architects who are arranging the property in such a manner that the location of any home will not interfere with the view of other homes on the tract. This feature is easily accomplished because of the varied elevation of the ground and the natural contour of the tract.

It is stated that this work will be completed within the next few days and large tracts will be offered to members,

and friends who are eligible for the club membership.

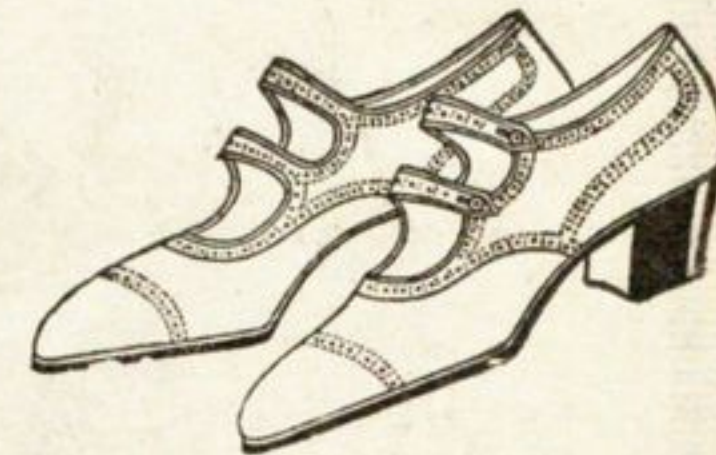

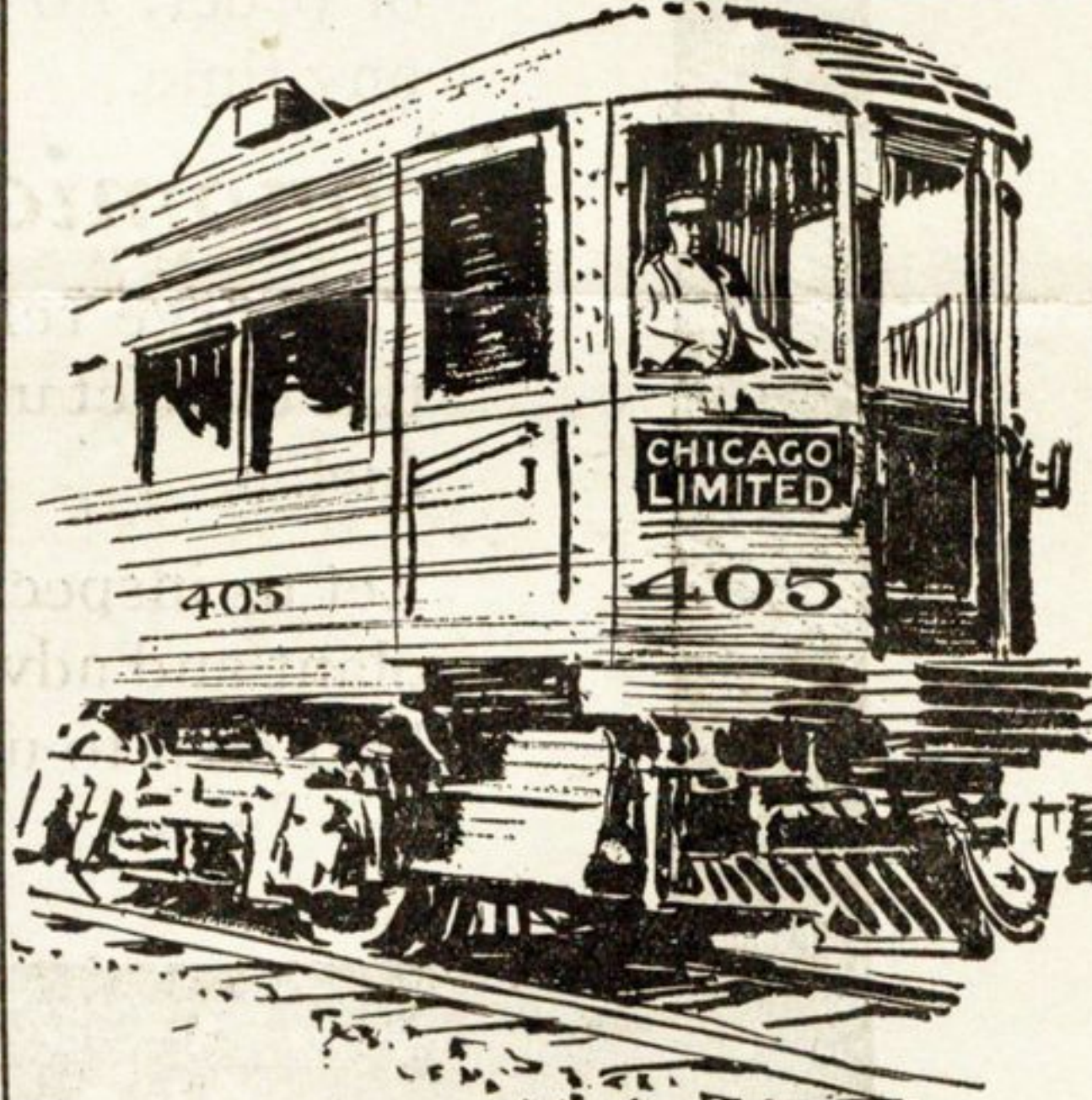
