

**SARG'S MARIONETTES
HERE NEXT WEDNESDAY**

Tony Sarg's Marionette described as "those delightful little wooden-headed actors who present the quaintest, most novel and artistic entertainment imaginable," will be seen in Jane Kuppenheimer Memorial hall, Skokie school, Winnetka, Wednesday afternoon and evening, December 5. The afternoon performance will be at 4 o'clock while the evening presentation it at 8:15.

"Hansel and Gretel," "Little Red Riding Hood," "Monsieur Le Capitaine" and "Ching and Chang" are the vehicles in this season's performances, and entertainment of most unusual quality is promised.

The Marionettes are operated by more than 400 invisible strings, they dance, sing and play and, all in all, act like real people. A corps of eight puppeteers is employed to operate the strings.

Sarg's stage settings are said to be unusually beautiful this year, the lighting and scenic effects being described as most elaborate.

"The Marionette performances," advance notices state, "are for children from three to ninety."

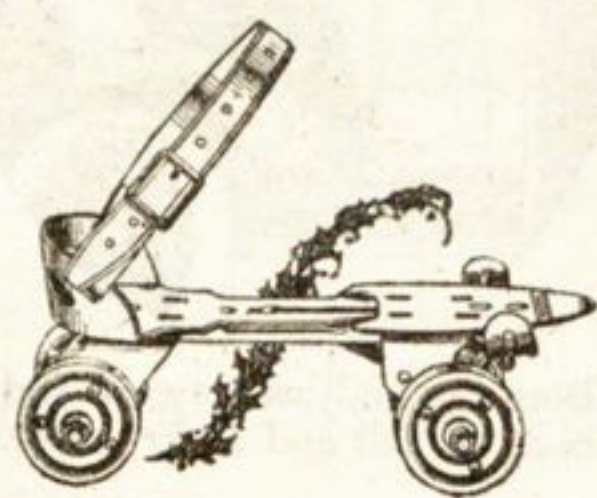

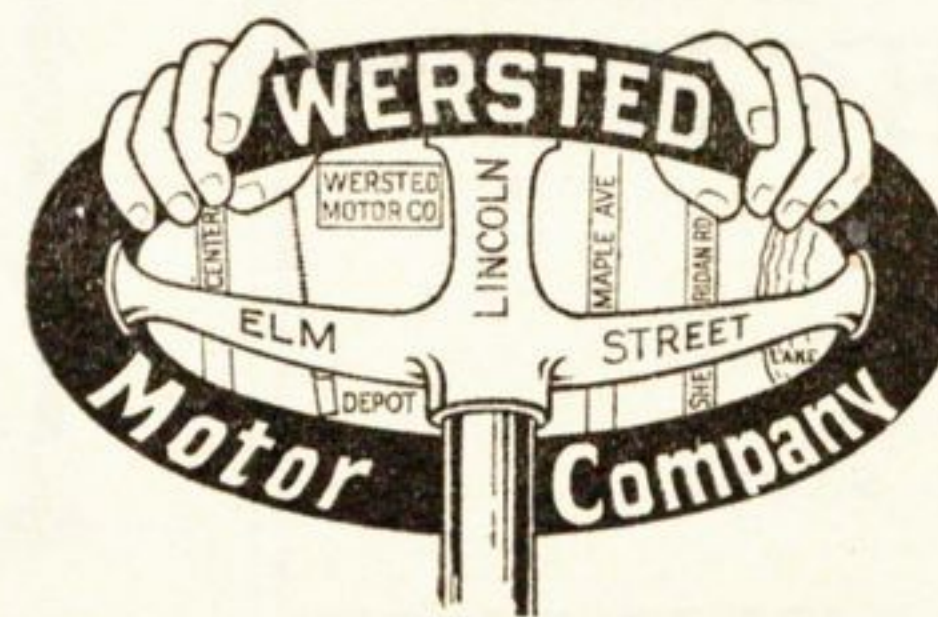
