

Police Raid Moonshine Joint in North Section

Twenty dozen quart bottles of beer, several gallons of liquor, and a complete still with all the apparatus and attachments was what Winnetka police seized when they raided the home of John Ostowsky, 1487 Ashbury avenue, Tuesday afternoon, November 27.

Ostowsky was brought before Magistrate Northrop who placed two charges against him, one, the illegal manufacture of intoxicating liquor, and the other, the sale of intoxicating liquor. Bonds were furnished by the defendant in the amount of \$3,000. The hearing will be held today.

It is said by the police that although the still was not in actual operation at the time of the raid, a large quantity of mash was found in the basement and several bottles of liquor were concealed in a bed on the upper floor of the home. The police destroyed a large quantity of the manufactured product by mixing it with kerosene, and the balance was brought to the station to be retained as evidence.

Second Goodspeed Talk at Parish House Monday
