Members at Indian Hill Await Good Old Winter

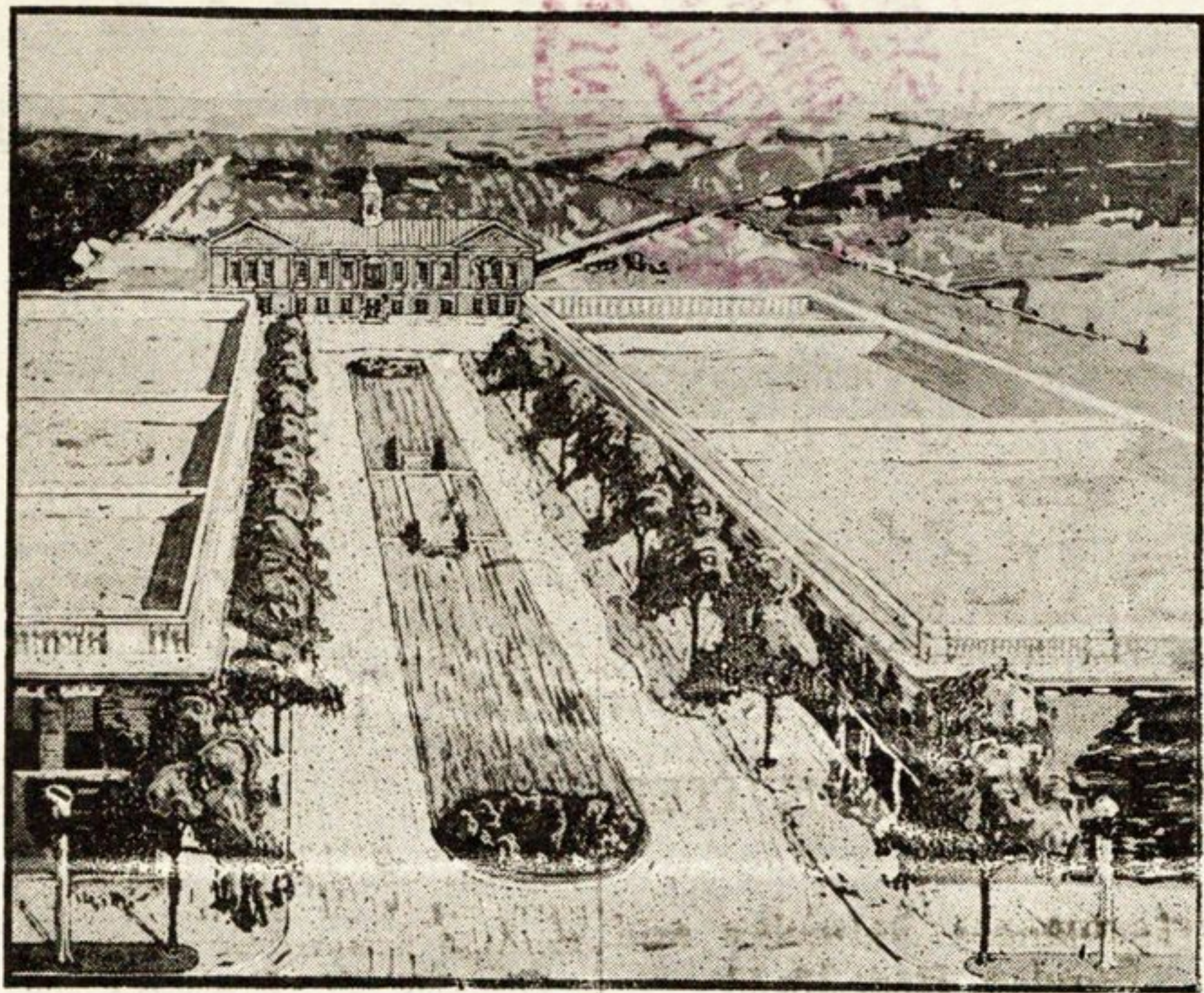
If old man Jack Frost will only come along and do his "stuff," members of the Indian Hill Country club will enjoy some thrilling winter sports.

Winnetka's Proposed Village Mall



As stated in a recent issue of Winnetka Talk, the Village has effected a definite plan insuring the contemplated Village Mall to be located in the center of Block 26, midway between Elm and Oak streets, and extending from Chestnut street east to the present public lane leading out to Elm street one-half block west of Linden street. Above illustration presents a birdseye view of the proposed Mall, looking east toward the proposed new Village hall. The Mall, or parkways, is to be flanked on either side by commercial structures which will conform in architectural de-

sign to the general plan for commercial buildings outlined by the Winnetka Plan Commission. Facing the Mall at the near end as pictured above, will be the contemplated Community Center, to be located on the site of the present Horace Mann school.

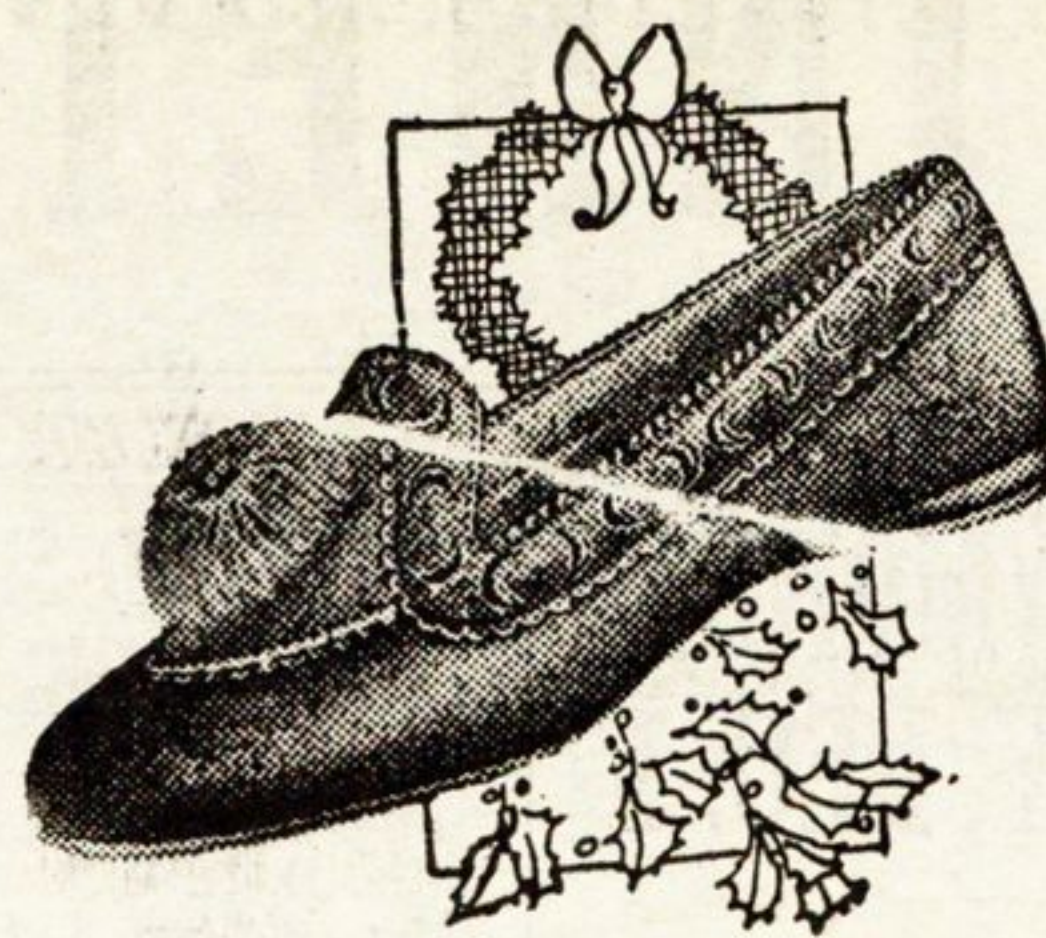
