

## DEATH TAKES JONAS MADSEN

Winnetka Pioneer and a  
Former Official

Jonas H. Madsen, well known Winnetka and north shore real estate and insurance man, passed away Tuesday, December 18, following an illness of almost a year's duration. Death was caused by a general physical breakdown.

Funeral services were held from the residence, 548 Fir street, Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Burial was at Rosehill.

Mr. Madsen had been a resident of Winnetka for 50 years, coming to the village with his parents when he was six years of age. He was born of Danish peasant folk and, by dint of hard work and an insatiable thirst for knowledge, achieved a remarkable financial success and a position of high respect and honor in the community. He was established in the real estate and insurance business in the village for a period of 20 years. He was at one time a member of the Village council and a justice of the peace.

Mr. Madsen was keenly interested in the history of the village and was perhaps the best informed person in the community in that regard. He loved to relate incidents that took place when the village was a mere hamlet and Indians still resided on the fringe of the white settlement. He boasted an excellent collection of records and relics reminiscent of the early days of the village.

Mr. Madsen was also a lover of the out-of-doors. He was an expert fisherman and hunter and in latter years spent considerable portion of his time in the woods.

Mr. Madsen is survived by his widow and two daughters, Mrs. Howard E. Bowers and Miss Gladys Eleanor Madsen.

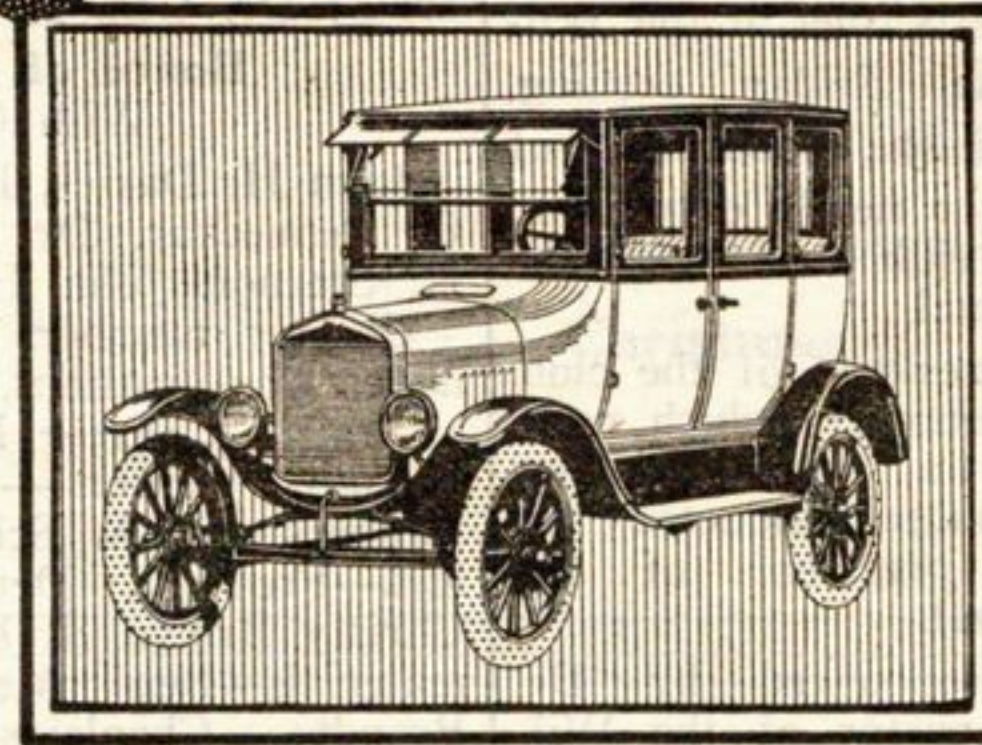
