Mrs. James Murray of Toronto, Canada, is visiting her son and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. James C. Murray, 431 Cumnor road.

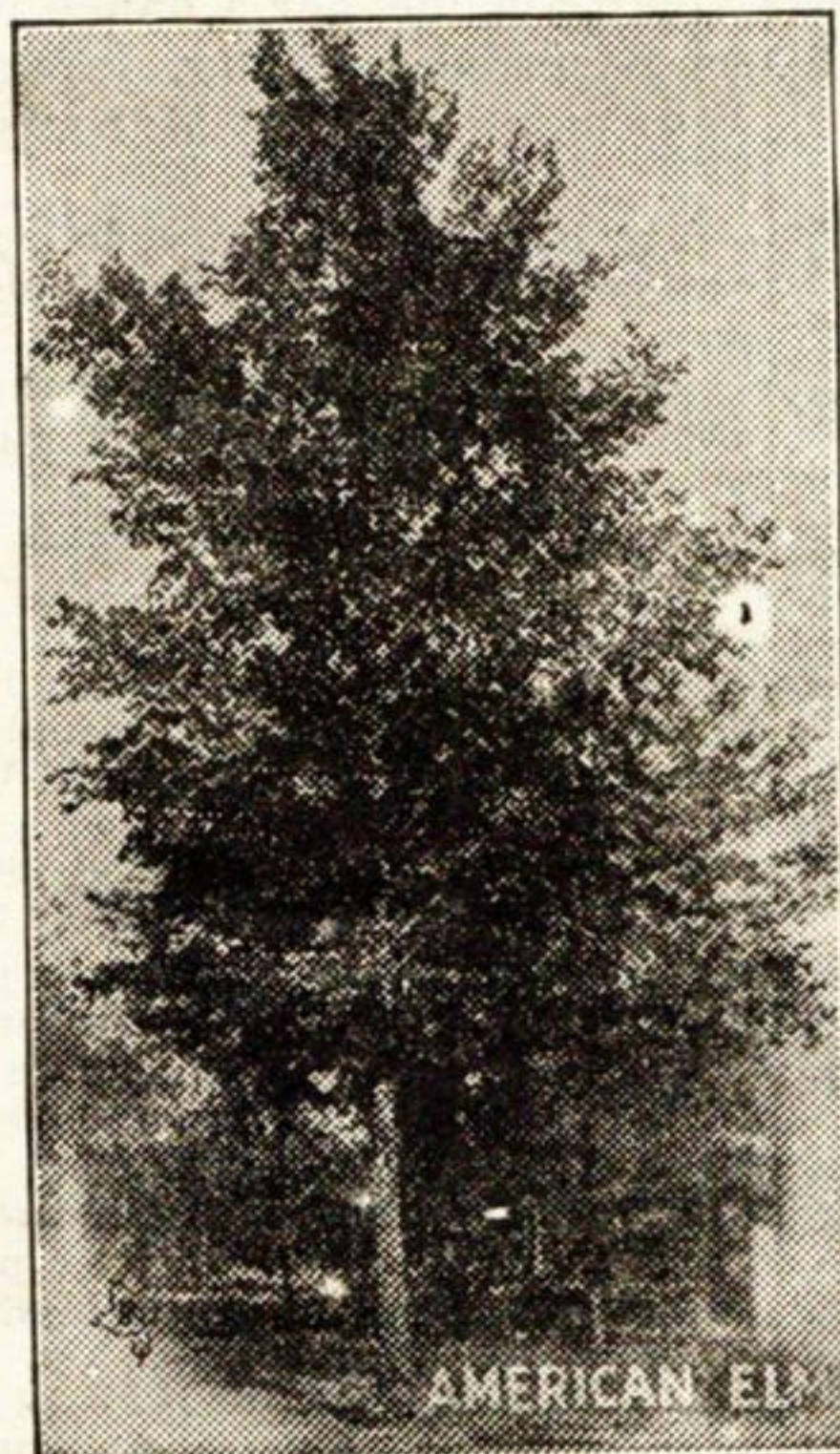
Mr. Frederick C. Little left Monday for a stay of several months in Pasadena, Cal.
